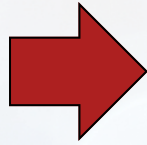

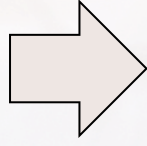

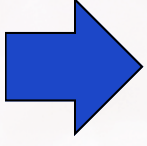
1. Pray. Scan the QR code to read 1 Timothy 2:1-3 and then take time to pray for those in authority and the restoration of righteousness in our nation.



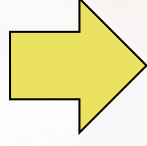
2. Prepare. Scan the QR code to register to vote or to verify that you are registered to vote.

Just in case. If you cannot make it on election day. Scan the QR code to get the facts on early voting.

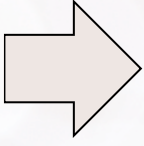

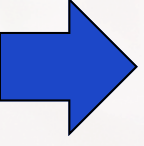

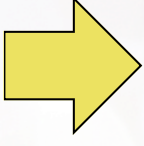
