Weather It Through The Storm



February brought about some weather that devasted several counties in the Appalachian Kentucky, Tennessee, and West Virginia regions. There have been several food pantries that our ministry serves that suffered some damage that was bad enough to shut them down temporarily. Some of the pantries experienced severe flooding, which means that they suffered loss of food, storage and the ability to serve the people in need. Kentucky suffered 21 deaths due to the February storms. plies, water, general household items. Some people have lost their homes, businesses, and jobs due to this flooding and have to start over. The people in this area need cleaning supplies; bleach, gloves, buckets, mops, shovels, diapers and wipes (adult and baby), etc. "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." *Jeremiah 29:11 (ESV)*.
