GOOD NEWS TO REPORT

Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you. *Luke 6:38.* In February, Steve got his license to drive the box truck that Mid-West Food Bank has offered to let us use to provide additional food to agencies in Eastern Kentucky. We were able to increase the amount of



food brought into the area by 16 pallets (about 20,000 pounds). It is our hope to be able to provide this additional food and supplies to this area on a monthly basis. With this increase in food we were able to provide 29 food pantries such things as cases of soup, canned vegetables, staples and snacks. The additional food was an answer to prayers for many of these agencies. As the needs of this area increase we are so thankful that the Lord has provided us with resources far greater than we had even hoped for in order to continue our mission. We are so thankful for all of our prayer partners and financial supporters. that come from near and far to spread good news!



Project Update

This past winter we had to rely on space heaters to provide heat for our warehouse and warmth for the workers. While this will work in a pinch, a long-term solution is needed. We are in the process of getting a natural gas line into the warehouse to provide much needed heat for the cold winter months. Once the gas line is finished we can install a permanent

heater. Please pray that this project can be completed before cold weather falls on us again.

February/March Distribution Updates

In February we completed another very successful distribution of over 70,000 pounds of food and supplies provided by Midwest Food Bank to 29 churches, missions and food pantries located in the Appalachians of Eastern Kentucky. We had a dedicated crew of 14 faithful volunteers from Illinois and Stanton Christian Church that worked a total of 117 hours to get all the food distributed.

In March we were able to transport an additional 20,000 pounds of food added to the usual 70,000 pounds. This allowed us to provide each agency with an additional 700 pounds for food and supplies for the month. A delicious lunch was provided by Pete Friedmansky, Patty Gordon and Tina Thomas for all volunteers.

Agency Update

One of the newest agencies to receive monthly food relief from our ministry is Buckhorn Children and Family Services (BCFS). BCFS operates a Campus-Based Residential Treatment Program for youth 13 to 17 years old from two locations in Eastern Kentucky:

- Buckhorn Children's Center Buckhorn, Kentucky (all-girls campus)
- Dessie Scott Children's Home Pine Ridge, Kentucky (all-boys campus)

Kids referred to these programs are survivors of chronic and frequently severe abuse and neglect. They are products of families that suffer from drug addiction, domestic violence, poverty, and a lack of education and parenting skills. They are challenged with mental disorders, developmental delays, and educational short-falls. Many of them have faced the unimaginable and often come to BCFS after a number of failed placements or when no other residential treatment program in the state will accept them.

For these children, it seems like no one cares. For them, they feel like there is nowhere to turn, no one to trust, and no place to go. At BCFS they show these children a hopeful world full of people who will walk the miles with them, who will meet them step for step.

Kentucky has one of the highest rates of child abuse and neglect deaths in the nation, and recently, the number of Kentucky children removed from homes because of abuse and neglect has reached unprecedented levels.



Since 1902, Buckhorn Children & Family Services has provided help and support—and paths for rebuilding lives to thousands of troubled children and families

across eastern Kentucky. A refuge in the heart of Central Appalachia for over 115 years, BCFS fulfills its mission—to provide a sanctuary of health, healing, and hope—by serving hundreds of kids and well over one thousand families each year. From the mom looking to save her child from substance abuse and self-harm to the teen searching for safety from abuse and neglect to the child needing a forever home, BCFS is there.
