## Distribution Update



Our Ministry completed its largest food distribution yet to the poverty-stricken area of Eastern Kentucky. Midwest Food Bank of Bloomington-Normal, Illinois provided the trucks and the food for the region. On June 6th, 24 volunteers helped distribute over

100,000 pounds of food to 30 Eastern Kentucky food relief agencies free of charge. The many volunteers worked together to prepare the food for pickup at our Stanton, Kentucky warehouse where each agency received 175 cases of food, including soup, canned fruit & vegetables, cereal, chips, pasta, beans, juice, protein bars and a variety of other items.

Why Kentucky? Don't we have needy families locally? Eastern Kentucky is home to some of the poorest counties in our nation. The New York Times ranked each county in the United States using six basic metrics: educational attainment, household income, jobless rate, disability rate, life expectancy and obesity rate. Weighing each equally, six counties in eastern Kentucky's coal country (Breathitt, Clay, Jackson, Lee, Leslie and Magoffin) ranked among the bottom 10 counties of our nation. In Lee County, the median annual household income is just over \$14,000 (\$39,000 less than the national average of \$53,000). Education is another big problem in that area of Kentucky, with the high school dropout rate at over 33% and only 3% continue on to receive a bachelor's degree, a fraction of the 29% national average, leading to an unemployment rate that is more than twice the national and the statewide average.

With all of this need there should be plenty of help available locally, right? Where we live, in McLean County, there are roughly 75 agencies that provide some form of food relief for needy families. In many counties of Eastern Kentucky there are only two, maybe three places where a hungry family can receive food at no cost. This is where our ministry's founder, Roger Whaley, chose to focus his efforts and where the ministry continues to provide food to thousands of hungry families today.

Our ministry operates solely on individual donations and the help of volunteers. If you have the time and desire to help with the monthly food distribution, there are a variety of tasks that need volunteers.
