Foreword

It is the ultimate love story—a story of God's redeeming love.

CHAPTERI

My Early Years (1963–1976)

When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a [wo]man, I put away childish things.

1 Corinthians 13:11

I have overcome the bondage imposed by the enemy of my soul by the precious blood of Jesus Christ and by the word of my testimony (Rev. 12:11)! I will never stop proclaiming the riches of God's glory available to all through the power of His Spirit, to those who allow Jesus Christ to dwell in their heart through faith, enabling them to be rooted and grounded in love and capable of comprehending the width and length and depth and height of His love for them (Eph. 3:16-19).

For most of my forty-eight years on this earth I was lord and master of my life. I was extremely selfish and self-sufficient and I worked hard to achieve status and recognition in all areas of my life. I have had an amazing professional career, flying helicopters for the U.S. Army and for the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). I have worked directly for generals and admirals and have traveled to many places in the world. I have seen incredible places and things like magnificent castles in the countryside of Germany and camels running in the deserts of the Middle East; I've explored caves in the Midwestern United States; I have seen polar bears, whales and other magnificent creatures in the wild on the north slope of Alaska and the Bering Sea; I have observed humpback whales breaching near the Galapagos Islands; and I have seen blue whales up close in the middle of the Pacific Ocean. However, even with all of that, I sensed an aching void in my heart that just could not be satisfied. I didn't know what my purpose was, but God began to stir my spirit and draw me to Him. I realized that all of the incredible things I had experienced could not fill the void in my heart. In 2003, the pastor of the church I was attending challenged the congregation to "40 Days of Purpose," where we collectively worked through The Purpose Driven Life by Rick Warren. I found that what was missing in my life was a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

It Was Jesus!

I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior and was born again, and my life changed forever! Since then Jesus has completely filled that void in my heart with His unconditional and pure love. I realized that I had been separated from God for a very long time. When I was in control of my life I was sinning against God, and the penalty for my sin was separation from Him (Rom. 3:23). Jesus Christ died on the cross to take away my sins and offered to me His free gift of salvation (Rom. 6:23). All I had to do was admit that I was a sinner, believe that Jesus died for my sins and ask for His forgiveness. I did. I asked Him to take over as Lord and Savior of my life and I gave up the role that I held for so long. I started to focus on the

things that matter to God and miracles began to occur in my life. It was as if He rearranged my very DNA. Everything about my life has changed!

He changed the way I think, the way I act and the way I react. Now I am living my life with full satisfaction and purpose. All things are new!

As I began to study the Word of God, I found the story of my life right there in the pages of the Bible. When I dug deeper into the Word, I became more and more excited about life as I developed an intimate relationship with Jesus, the lover of my soul. As a result, my life was being completely

transformed. I hope that my testimony will encourage you to see how God has worked in my life and that you will realize that God is no respecter of persons. He does not show partiality for one person over another (Acts 10:34). The incredible miracles that God performed in the lives of Moses, Abraham, Joseph, Paul and Debora Barr, He can and will do for you if you surrender your life to Him and love Him with all of your heart!

Much of the content of this book comes directly from my journal and emails that I sent to friends. Many of these entries and messages contain my written prayers and conversations with God. Each journal entry or email is preceded by the date of the entry, and for the sake of this book has been edited to correct mistakes. I also changed many of the names of people in my life to protect their identities.

What follows is God's story of my life. It is my story of transformation and I hope it blesses you. If you don't yet know Jesus as your personal Lord and Savior, I pray that you too will surrender your life to Him and let Him take control of every area of your life. You will never be the same!

My Beginning

I came into this world in December of 1963, the daughter of young parents who each had difficult childhoods, and the oldest of four children. Both of my parents came from homes where a parent died when they were still children. My dad was an only child and his father died when he was just ten years old. Likewise, my mom's mother died when she was ten years old. She was only sixteen years old when she married my dad to get away from her alcoholic father and the responsibilities of raising her two younger brothers.

I knew and loved God as a little girl. My mother took me to Catholic Church every week where I learned about God, Jesus and religion. My understanding of who God is was very different at that time in my life. I remember one Sunday afternoon I had a plan that I just knew would work because I believed God would perform a miracle for me. Going into my bedroom, I closed the door and put a plastic model horse in the middle of the room. I then moved other things out of the way and began to pray to God that He would turn it into a real horse because I loved horses and wanted one of my own. Looking back on that incident, I am glad God didn't answer that prayer because I have no idea how I would have gotten that horse out of the house or where I would have kept him if God had answered that prayer!

When I was growing up, I was very insecure and did not make friends easily. I had trouble connecting with kids my own age and usually had one or two older friends whom I connected with. For as long as I can remember, I have been competitive and achievement-oriented, striving to excel in everything I got involved in. I was also very much a tomboy growing up. One day when I was quite young, my mother dropped me off at a neighbor's house for dance lessons and I cried the entire time I was there because I was so shy and didn't want to participate in any of the

dancing lessons. My mom never took me back. Instead I played softball and was very involved in music, playing the clarinet in the orchestra and marching band and playing the piano for many years. I was also driven

academically and excelled in school, especially in science. In elementary school, I had already decided on a future career as a doctor and was working toward that. Little did I know that my life would not follow the plan I had envisioned.

In sixth grade I began to exhibit signs of stress in my life: I started compulsively pulling out my hair, which left embarrassing bald spots on my head. I now know that this disorder is called trichotillomania. I

ended up struggling with that disorder for about fifteen years. When it started, I was babysitting a lot for my younger brothers and sister and the foster children my family took in at the time. We would usually have two infants at a time in foster care. So much responsibility in addition to my self-imposed pressure to excel at school, music and sports was beginning to take its toll on me.
