ADVA APPOINTS NEW DIRECTOR OF WILLIAM F. GREEN STATE VETERANS HOME

Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) Commissioner Kent Davis has appointed Charles "NoNo" Allen to serve as the department's new Director of the William F. Green State Veterans Home in Bay Minette.

Allen will be responsible for monitoring the daily operation of the home to ensure compliance with contractual agreements as well as federal and state regulations, coordinating equipment purchases and repairs, preparing statistical and financial studies and reports on funding requirements, advising the Executive Director on the technical administrative aspects of the operation of the home to include, but not limited to resident care and treatment, and funding and material utilization/requirements and records management.

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs constantly emphasizes this idea that 'service never stops,' and Charlie is a great example of that mindset," said ADVA Commissioner Kent Davis. "We are so excited to have him as a member of our team and know that as a veteran himself, he will ensure that we deliver on America's promises to hold ourselves personally and professionally accountable in delivering exceptional care to our nation's heroes."

Allen served in the U.S. Army and Alabama National Guard as an Incentive Officer, retiring earlier this year after 20-plus years of service. He has been awarded numerous medals throughout his career, including the Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Army Achievement Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Iraq Campaign Medal, Combat Action Badge, and Basic Aviation Badge.

Allen will assume his new role as Director of the William F. Green State Veterans Home on October 2.

MONTGOMERY, Ala. -POW/MIA CEREMONY

A ceremony to commemorate National POW/MIA Recognition Day was held on the South Lawn of the Alabama State Capitol at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 16.

The ceremony was to honor and remember the brave men and women who endured the hardships as Prisoners of War, the Missing in Action who are still unaccounted for, and pay special recognition to their families who bore the cost of war.

U.S. Army Major General (Ret.) Janet Cobb, who serves as executive director of the USS Alabama Battleship Commission and Battleship Memorial Park, gave the keynote address. She was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, Signal Corps in May 1978 from the University of Alabama ROTC program, where she was named a Distinguished Military Graduate. MG (Ret.) Cobb was the fifty-fourth general officer and the first female general officer to graduate from the University of Alabama. In April 2017, MG (Ret.) Cobb was one of seven selectees for the inaugural University of Alabama ROTC Hall of Fame. In 2016, she retired from the Army of the United States after 42 years in uniform. Her decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3), and various campaign and service awards.

The ceremony included the raising of the POW/MIA Flag, featuring patriotic music, a wreath-laying ceremony, and the playing of Taps. Traditionally held on the third Friday in September, the ceremony was moved to Saturday to accommodate and encourage public attendance.

The observance is one of six days of the year that Congress has mandated the flying of the POW/MIA flag at federal buildings. The Alabama Legislature passed legislation in 2008 that allows for the POW/MIA flag to be flown at state buildings as well.

VA expands burial benefits for Veterans and their families

WASHINGTON — Today, VA announced that Veterans, and their families, caregivers, and survivors now have access to expanded burial benefits to help with end-of-life expenses related to a Veteran's gravesite, burial, funeral, and transportation of remains to their final resting place. Burial benefits are available to individuals who pay for a Veteran's burial and funeral costs that are not reimbursed by any other organization. The updated burial benefits are:

- Expanded reimbursement of transportation expenses, to include costs for transporting remains, to state or Tribal Veterans' cemeteries in addition to previously eligible national cemeteries.
- Broadened eligibility to more individuals who are eligible to receive the transportation benefit.
- Instituted a more generous single payment rate for non-service-connected burial benefits.
- Extended the VA plot or interment allowance to Tribal organizations.

"Last fiscal year, VA delivered more than 84,000 burial benefits to families of Veterans," said **VA Under Secretary for Benefits Joshua Jacobs**. "Expanding burial benefits means we can ensure Veterans are honored in their final resting place, and assist their family, caregivers, and survivors during the difficult time of their loved one's passing."

VA provides burial benefits for all legal burial types, including cremation, burial at sea, and donation of remains to a medical school. Eligible individuals include a surviving spouse or legal partner, surviving child, parent or executor of the Veteran's estate. Additionally, VA may pay burial benefits to a funeral home or third party who handled burial arrangements for a Veteran whose remains are unclaimed.

Veterans are encouraged to plan with end-of-life benefits provided by VA. These benefits include VA life insurance, care preferences, survivor benefits, and burial benefits that can be applied for in advance of a Veteran's passing. Visit www.va.gov/plan-ahead to learn more.

There is no time limit to file for a service-connected burial, plot or interment allowance, or the transportation benefit. However, claims for non-service-connected burial benefits must be filed within two years of the Veteran's burial or cremation. A non-service-connected burial benefit is one where the cause of death was not related to military service.


