TOPIC: HEALTHCARE

ISSUE: Opioid Settlement Funds

BACKGROUND:

The state of Alabama will receive nearly \$300 million in Opioid Settlement Funds.

DISCUSSION: 9.8% of Alabamians are veterans. Over 10% of veterans have been diagnosed with substance use disorder.² An even greater number of veterans struggle with undiagnosed addiction and their rates of addiction continue to increase.¹ Families of Veterans also suffer. With 377, 310 Veterans and an average family size of 3.22; the number of Veterans & Family Members (1.215M) is nearly 23.9% of Alabama's total population (5.07M)

RECOMMENDATION: 23.9% of the Opioid Settlement funds should be earmarked to provide addiction prevention services to Alabama Veterans and to care for Veterans and Family Members struggling with substance use disorder

BACKGROUND: Fort McClelland Veterans have yet to be recognized for their toxic exposure.

DISCUSSION: The PACT Act ensures Healthcare and benefits are available to those who served in Vietnam, Gulf

RECOMMENDATION: All Alabama Veterans who were exposed to toxins should be declared eligible for coverage under the PACT Act.

BACKGROUND: Currently Alabama has only 3 CCBHC-Expansion grant clinics.⁵ Alabama Department of Mental Health is beginning to plan for the implementation of the CCBHC model.

DISCUSSION: CCBHCs were created in 2014 as a part of the Excellence in Mental Health Act. CCBHCs are specifically intended to strengthen the relationships between local VAs and community-based clinics, improve outreach to veterans, and increase access to care for veterans and their families."

RECOMMENDATION: Alabama's 400,000 Veterans should be represented in the planning process for CCBHC adoption by including all currently funded CCBHC-Es in the planning process, particularly those with a track record of strong service to Veterans and their families, in order to ensure the expansion of the CCBHC model meets Alabama's Veterans needs in the future.

TOPIC: EDUCATION

ISSUE: The Alabama GI Dependent Scholarship

BACKGROUND: The Alabama Gl Dependent Scholarship® has been amended to limit educational benefits to Alabama Veterans' Dependents.

DISCUSSION: One key missing definition in the current law is "Required Educational Expenses". Without this darky, each institution can determine what is deemed to be required, thereby creating inequitable access to this benefit for Veteran families.

RECOMMENDATION: Redraft the Alabama GI Dependent Scholarship to mirror the Post 9/11 GI Bill and define "Required Educational Expenses" to include Tuition, Fees, Housing, Books, Supplies and Moving Expenses."

TOPIC: BENEFITS

ISSUE: Veteran eligibility for burial in Alabama Veteran Cemeteries.

BACKGROUND: In the past, National Guard who have not served in a federal call-up

(unless they are retired) were not eligible to be buried in one of Alabama's Veteran Cemeteries.

DISCUSSION: National Guard and Reserve service members are eligible for burial in National Veteran Cemeteries based on several criteria.* In the past, Alabama National Guard and Reserve service members had to meet a more stringent set of requirements for burial in Alabama state Veterar Cemeteries. 20 Recent "policy" changes have, for the time being, adjusted the requirements to match National requirements. However, no law exists to protect this policy.

RECOMMENDATION: Pass legislation to mandate burial in Alabama's State Veteran Cemeteries be available to all Veterans, including those not currently eligible.

Among our many facilities, we operate state veterans homes, a state veterans cemetery, and numerous Veterans Service Offices (VSO) around the state.

The separate U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) is comprised of a Central Office (VACO) and field facilities throughout the nation administered by its three major line organizations: the Veterans Health Administration (VHA), the Veterans Benefits Administration (VBA), and the National Cemetery Administration (NCA).

ALABAMA G.I. DEPENDENTS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Alabama G.I. Dependent Scholarship Booklet

This academic scholarship program is administered by the Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs and applies to the dependents of Alabama's disabled veterans. This pamphlet was prepared to give a brief summary of these benefits. If full and comprehensive treatment of the law is desired, it may be found in Chapter 6 of Title 31 of the Code of Alabama (1975). Representatives of this department, known as Veterans Service Officers, are located in county offices throughout the state. Their offices are normally located in the county courthouse or in the immediate vicinity. They will be happy to assist applicants with these educational benefits. Their services are entirely free. DISTINCTIVE LICENSE PLATES

To obtain a Veterans Distinctive License Plate, a veteran must present proof of service. This may be a copy of their DD Form 214, driver's license with veteran designation, or any other form with evidence of military service or veteran status.

VETERAN DRIVERS LICENSE

Alabama Department of Public Safety

Since May 1, 2013, Alabama veterans have had the option of displaying proof of military service on their driver's licenses.

To establish proof of service, a veteran must visit one of the Alabama Law Enforcement Agency's Driver License examining offices, a license commissioner's office or probate office, and present a DD-214 form from the U.S. Department of Defense that shows an "honorable" or "general under honorable conditions" status.

VETERAN TREATMENT COURT

Veteran Treatment Courts (VTCs) were developed to avoid unnecessary incarceration of veterans with mental health and/or substance abuse problems. In the program, veterans may receive medical and mental health treatment, training and help with finding a job, as well as housing and transportation assistance. Veterans who successfully complete the program will have the charges against them dismissed and may be eligible to have their records expunged



Douglas "Mike" Day, a highly decorated U.S. Navy SEAL who survived being shot 27 times while deployed to Iraq, passed away earlier this week on March 27. Day served 21 years in the

Navy and later worked as an author and an advocate for wounded military veterans.

The incredible true story of former Navy SEAL Mike Day, who survived being shot twenty-seven times while deployed in Iraq.

Perfectly Wounded is the remarkable story of an American hero whose incredible survival defies explanation, and whose blessed life of service continues in the face of unimaginable odds.

On the night of April 6, 2007, in Iraq's Anbar Province, Senior Chief Mike Day, his team of Navy SEALs, and a group of Iraqi scouts were on the hunt for a high-level al Qaeda cell. Day was the first to enter a 12×12 room where four terrorist leaders were waiting in ambush. When the gunfight was over, he took out all four terrorists in the room, but not before being shot twenty-seven times and hit with grenade shrapnel. Miraculously, Day cleared the rest of the house and rescued six women and children before walking out on his own to an awaiting helicopter, which flew him to safety.

While in the hospital, the Navy SEAL lost fifty-five pounds in two weeks. It took almost two years for Day to physically recover from his injuries, although he still deals with pain. Like so many veterans, doctors diagnosed Day with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder and Traumatic Brain Injury — the invisible wounds of war.

Angel Fire Vietnam Veterans Memorial, Angel Fire, NM

The story of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Angel Fire, New Mexico began 52 years ago on May 22, 1968 Angel Fire is home to the nation's first monument to honor veterans of the Vietnam War. On U.S. 64, just north of Angel Fire, the Vietnam Veterans Memorial features a chapel, visitor center and museum, a veterans' walk and a "Huey" helicopter on display. Special events to memorialize veterans and active duty servicemembers include Labor Day Bricklaying and the Run For The Wall Memorial Day Motorcycle Ride. Up to 2,000 people attended the bricklaying this year. Each brick bears the name of a living or deceased veteran service member, their military branch and the vears they served (a brick with no end date means they are still active duty). Bricks are available for purchase by anyone wanting to honor a military service member or veteran. About 5,000 bricks line the memorial. The Memorial was originally known as the Vietnam Veterans Peace and Brotherhood Chapel and had its origins in a battle near Con Thien, South Vietnam in which 17 men lost their lives. Among the men, was David Westphall, son of Victor and Jeanne Westphall. The parents of Lt. David Westphall received notice of their son's death in Vietnam. Lt. Westphall, USMC,

David Westphall had enlisted in the Marine Corps and left for college after his initial four-year enlistment was over. He received a degree in Spanish from the University of Montana and rejoined the Marines, receiving a commission as an officer. He was assigned as platoon leader of Company B, 1st Battalion, 4th Marines, and was deployed to Vietnam. David had survived the bite of a deadly viper only to succumb to bullet wounds on that fateful day in May.

was leading a patrol in Con Thien when his platoon was ambushed and thirteen men were killed in action Thanks to their vision and determination the memorial exists today to honor not only these 17 Marines but all

members of America's armed forces.

Meeting called to order at 8:30 a.m. by President Lou Lartigue – 46 in attendance - Location Saucy Q BBQ Opening Prayer – Chaplain Michael Austin, Pledge – Jim Jeffries, Lou Lartigue – Welcomed the new people. Minutes for February, USCG-ATC provided a tour, and lunch on us in the galley. Newsletters: 7 snail mail newsletters and 435 emails. Treasurer's report – Tom Swartz –January hat collected \$236.00. Last month SAVC presented a grant to QOV, and SAVC received a thank you letter from them.

Grant Presentation to Capt Eli "Out of the Deep", who takes Veterans and their families on fishing cruises on Mobile Bay. Campbell's Caregivers, Sandy Campbell, and her family take care of elderly veterans. They go every year to the Senior Games, this year they will be going to DeMoines, Iowa. One of the veterans they care for is 104 years old, Taylor Howard.

VSO Report - Jim Jeffries, Past President American Legion, state of Alabama – Current Veterans Affairs. A relatively new chapter of AMVETS, Elberta, AL they have a little over 60 members, they are very active in the Elberta and Lillian area. American Legion – Veterans Retreat is a partnership with the VA out of the Birmingham Tuscaloosa area. American Legion Department Convention Montgomery June 22-25. Marine Corp League of Alabama convention in Montgomery June 22-23. 12th Annual State of Alabama POW/MIA ceremony, Montgomery, South lawn of the Capital Sept 16, 2023. Alabama Department Veterans Affairs –

Commissioner - Admiral Kent Davis, Sissy-Louise Moore, and Linda Jenkins. - Cemetery's recent groundbreaking for expansion of the cemetery, working on the columbarium's first, (above-ground internments for cremated remains.) Veterans cemeteries already have the vault in the ground, they will be installing over 2700 vaults. Plans are to deliver the crypts in the July timeframe and the whole project is projected to be completed by the end of the year. In 2022 Congress passed a new law called the Burial Equity Act which allows state cemeteries to start burying those traditional National Guardsmen and Reservists. ALDVA is on track to start burying those veterans in May, 2023. A few months ago there was a theft at the cemetery, most of the plagues were recovered, the wall is being prepared to place the plaques including the National Guard and Space Force. ADVA is exploring the possibilities of using robotic lawnmowers at the cemetery. The new 5th state Veterans home is on schedule in Enterprise Al. Looking to open that facility In the summer of 2024. State of Alabama funds a Dependent scholarship program which augments the Federal government GI bill which is a scholarship for veterans. The Alabama scholarship funds scholarships for dependents of selected disabled veterans. The application process is being put online for quicker, more efficient ease of application. Federal VA - Federal PACT Act passed in August 2022, the biggest expansion of veterans benefits

Outreach and Engagement department of AlDVA: Sissy-Louise Moore ALDVA in 2022 had 6 town halls in ten months, this year they are on the books to go to Enterprise,

since the creation of the GI Bill toward the end of WWII has added a lot of protection for veterans who were

exposed to toxic agents.
