August 1 – August 31



### MOBILE BAY AREA VETERAN OF THE YEAR NOMINATIONS

Veteran of the Year nominations for the 2023 Veteran of the Year will be accepted by the Mobile Bay Area Veterans Day Commission, from August 1 to August 31, 2023. The deadline for nominations is midnight, August 31, 2023.

### **Award Criteria:**

- 1. The purpose of the Mobile Bay Area Veteran of the Year Award is to recognize a living Mobile Bay Area veteran who has not only served his/her country in an outstanding manner but has used the leadership skills and abilities learned in the service to our Nation to improve the community through selfless volunteer service to the Mobile Bay Area.
- 2. Must be a resident of the Mobile Bay Area, which includes Mobile and Baldwin Counties of Alabama.
- 3. Must be a living veteran of one of the six armed forces of the United States, including Reserve and National Guard, or the United Sates Merchant Marine.
- 4. May be awarded for a single act or for continuous service.
- 5. May not be a previous recipient of the Mobile Bay Veteran of the Year Award.
- 6. A DD-214 or other proof of service must be submitted with the nomination packet.

The award will be presented at the Honors Luncheon at Fort Whiting National Guard Armory on the Veterans Day commemoration on Friday, November 10, 2023.

The nomination will be valid for three years.

### **Congressional Gold Medal**

On Nov. 23, 2011, President Barack Obama signed the law to award all Montford Point Marines with the Congressional Gold Medal. The gold medal, authorized by Public Law 112–59 was awarded to the Montford Point Marines in recognition of their personal sacrifice and service to their country during World War II.

### WHO IS A MONTFORD POINT MARINE?

They are the first African-Americans to enlist in the U.S. Marine Corps after President Franklin Roosevelt issues an Executive Order establishing the Fair Employment Practices Commission in June 1941. The recruits trained at Camp Montford Point in Jacksonville, NC from August 26, 1942 until the camp was decommissioned on September 9, 1949.

The largest number of black Marines to serve in combat during WW II took part in the seizure of Okinawa, with approximately 2,000 seeing action.

The Marine Corps was slow to carry out integration orders, but they deactivated Montford Point as a segregated training facility in September of 1949 and started sending black Recruits to training at Parris Island and San Diego. The split command had produced over 20,000 new Marines over the years at Montford Point.

### The Montford Point Marine

Association (MPMA) is a nonprofit military veterans' organization, founded to memorialize the legacy of the first African Americans to serve in the <u>United States Marine Corps</u>. The first African American U.S. Marines were trained at <u>Camp Montford Point</u>, in <u>Jacksonville</u>, <u>North Carolina</u>, from 1941 to 1949.

The organization supports educational assistance programs, veterans programs, and community services, with an emphasis on improving the social conditions of the growing population of military veterans who are disabled or senior citizens.

Membership in the nonprofit organization is open to veterans and active members of all branches of the <u>U.S. Armed Forces</u> regardless of race, creed, or national origin. The MPMA also hosts the MPMA Ladies Auxiliary. Membership in the Ladies Auxiliary is open to wives, daughters, sisters, and mothers of members or former members of the United States Armed Forces.

### MONTFORD POINT MARINE MEMORIAL

The Montford Point Marines Memorial is dedicated to the legacy of nearly 20,000 African-Americans who served in the Marine Corps from 1942 - 1949, but trained in a segregated training facility know as Montford Point Camp, Jacksonville, NC. The memorial tells the story through architecture and sculpture. The memorial is located within the LeJeune Memorial Gardens in Jacksonville, NC.

### Public Law 116 - 67 National POW/MIA Flag Act

Public Law 116-67

Date Approved November 7, 2019 Full Title

An act to amend title 36, United States Code, to require that the POW/MIA flag be displayed on all days that the flag of the United States is displayed on certain Federal property.

Every third Friday in September is the National Day of Recognition for prisoners of war and service members who are missing in action. Ceremonies are set to take place across the county, but in Alabama, the public is <u>invited</u> to honor these service members Saturday morning at the state capitol.

From World War I, World War II, the Korean War and Vietnam, nearly 2,000 Alabamians are still MIA and 100 are POWs.

### **PACT Act benefits:**

# Claims received by August 9 will be eligible for 12 months of backdated compensation

Thanks to the <u>PACT Act</u>, millions of Veterans who were exposed to burn pits, Agent Orange, and other toxic substances are now eligible for VA health care and benefits.

While there is no deadline to apply for PACT Actrelated benefits, there is urgency. Most Veterans and survivors who apply for benefits or submit an "Intent to File" by August 9, if granted, will have their benefits backdated to August 10th of last year — the day that President Biden signed the PACT Act into law.

VA facilities are hosting a nationwide Summer VetFest in July to encourage veterans to apply today. The VetFest will include more than 50 events across the country to inform Veterans, their families, caregivers, and survivors about the PACT Act. These events will be casual summer gatherings, featuring Veterans, their families, Veteran advocates, and the VA health care and benefits professionals who serve them.

Many of these events will also feature food and music, as well as VA staff who are ready to personally help Veterans apply or submit an intent to file, get screened for toxic exposures, or even apply to come work at VA. For Veterans that cannot attend a local event, VA.gov/PACT is a one-stop shop to learn about and apply for PACT Act-related care and benefits. They can also apply by calling 1-800-MYVA411.

## VA has processed 425,000 PACT Act claims since law enacted

WASHINGTON – The Department of Veterans Affairs has processed roughly 425,000 benefits claims for illnesses related to toxic exposure since the PACT Act was signed into law last year, agency officials told senators on Wednesday.

The law seeks to provide an easier path to health care and benefits for veterans who served near open-air burn pits, which were used throughout the 1990s and the post-9/11 wars to burn garbage, jet fuel and other materials. Veterans diagnosed with cancer, respiratory issues and lung disease at young ages have blamed exposure to the toxic fumes from these pits, but the VA contended for years that there wasn't sufficient evidence to support their claims.

Additionally, the PACT Act expanded health care eligibility to post-9/11 combat veterans and added 23 conditions related to burn pits and other toxic exposures to the VA's list of service presumptions.

### Japanese-American Soldiers Were Once Used As 'Bait' To Train Attack Dogs On Mississippi Island

(Tribune News Service) — Billed as a "secret mission" during World War II, the U.S. military used Japanese-American soldiers as "bait" in a failed attempt to train attack dogs on a Mississippi Gulf Coast island.

After only four months, the Cat Island Training Center and the experiment were abandoned. A more successful experiment was later conducted on the island which paired dogs and pigeons to be used as messenger teams.

Military working dogs continued to play an important role as sentries, messengers and even attack dogs throughout the rest of the war. Many of the dogs trained on Cat Island, as well as the soldiers used as bait, would travel to Africa and Italy with the fabled 442nd Regimental Combat Team to fight the Axis.

The mission of the Nisei on Cat Island remained classified and unknown to the world for decades. Not until 2010 did President Barack Obama award the entire 442nd, including the men of the 100th Infantry Battalion and those at Cat Island, the Congressional Gold Medal for their service.


