(ADVA) Commissioner Kent Davis has appointed Samantha Wise to serve as the Director of the new Command Sg. Maj. Bennie G. Adkins State Veterans Home in Enterprise, Alabama.

RGC project team members of the Command Sergeant Major Bennie G. Adkins State Veterans Home participated in the ribbon cutting alongside local, state, and federal partners in Enterprise, AL. The home will house 174 residents in six neighborhoods. Each neighborhood will include rooms with private bathrooms, community living rooms, a kitchenette for meals and snacks, and outdoor porches. One of the neighborhoods will be a dedicated memory-care unit.

This day was possible because of teamwork. The City of Enterprise, Ala., has been an incredible partner throughout this process.

# Bennie G. Adkins - American Hero



Bennie G. Adkins was deployed to Vietnam three times, with his most heroic effort during his second tour leading to receiving a Medal of Honor in 2014. He distinguished himself during 38 hours of close-combat fighting while serving as an Intelligence Sergeant with the  $5^{th}$  Special Forces Group at Camp A Shau in the Republic of Vietnam from March 9 to 12, 1966.

When the camp was attacked, then Sgt. 1st Class Adkins rushed through intense enemy fire and manned a mortar position defending the camp. He continued to mount a defense even while receiving several direct hits from enemy mortars. He temporarily turned over the mortar to another soldier and ran through exploding mortar rounds to rescue several soldiers wounded near the center of camp. By the end of the battle, Adkins was hit 18 times by enemy fire.

"Command Sgt. Maj. Bennie G. Adkins is an American hero who was well-known statewide for his bravery and heroism, especially in southeastern Alabama with his close ties to the community," said SBVA Deputy Vice-Chairman Chad Richmond. "Command Sgt. Maj. Adkins was loved by everyone who knew him, and it is an honor to have his name on the new state Veterans home."

## South Alabama Veterans Council VETERANS SPOTLIGHT

AETCM Timothy John Monahan, USCG (Ret)



Mobile's AETCM Timothy Monahan retired on October 1, 2019, after over 30 years of faithful service to the Coast Guard and our Nation. With an incredible list of achievements throughout his career, selfless service was an outstanding way to characterize his service to our Nation. Monahan is from Florissant, Missouri, he studied Paramedic at the University of South Alabama, graduating in 1996. Monahan is a talented musician. He plays harmonica, guitar, bagpipes, and other musical instruments. On many occasions, he has graced us with his bagpipes at veterans events.

Timothy John Monahan (Tim) enlisted into the United States Coast Guard (USCG) in March of 1989. Upon his successful graduation, Seaman Apprentice reported for duty to USCG Base St. Louis, where he stood duty as boat crew for search and rescue upon the Mississippi River. Within six months he was advanced to Seaman and performed duties working in the carpenter shop constructing Navigational Day Boards for the entire mid-west portion of the United States.

In August of 1990, Seaman Monahan reported to the Aviation Technical Training Center in Elizabeth City, North Carolina. Here he learned the operational and technical aspects of all Coast Guard Airframes.

Upon Graduating from his technical training, Petty Officer Third Class Monahan reported for duty to the Aviation Training Center in Mobile, Alabama, where he quickly became Qualified as an Avionics man in an HU-25 Falcon. In his new duty status, he flew on numerous missions, including Aids to Navigation and Search and Rescue. In one case, Petty Officer Monahan flew cover when the Sunset Unlimited disaster happened, keeping the news and media aircraft at bay.

In 1996, Petty Officer Monahan reported for duty to his new Air station in Clearwater, Florida. He was advanced to a

Second-Class Petty Officer and qualified in the HH-60 (Big Iron) Jayhawk helicopter. His duties included many deployments to the Caribbean Basin and the Bahamas in support of anti-drug and migrant smuggling operations.

In 2000, Petty Officer Monahan transferred to Cape Cod, MA. He advanced to AET1 and was the HU-25 shop supervisor. Being dual qualified, Petty Officer Monahan stood ready crew duty on the HU-25 Falcon and utilized his Paramedic training skills on numerous Medical Evacuations (medivac) on the HH-60.

After his five-year tour in Cape Cod, Petty Officer Monahan returned to Mobile, AL., and was assigned to the HH-60 shop. He supervised the HH-60 avionics maintenance and was a watch captain, where he scheduled his duty section. In August 2005, hurricane Katrina made landfall in Plaquemines Parish, Louisiana. Causing devastation along the Gulf Coast. Petty Officer Monahan was instrumental in his duties, working with personnel from every Coast Guard Air Station that brought assets to Mobile Al. He coordinated with supply to ensure the maintenance crews had what they needed to keep the planes in a ready condition. During this time, Petty Officer Monahan was advanced to E7.

In 2010, Chief Monahan returned to Air Station Cape Cod, where he in charge of the Avionics shop. He stood Officer of the Day duties and flew medivac cases. In a short two years, Chief Monahan was advanced to Senior Chief. He transferred to Barbers Point Hawaii and was the C-130 avionics shop supervisor.

In 2013, Senior Chief Monahan transferred to Air Station Los Angeles, where he assumed the duty of Command Senior Chief. In this role, Senior Chief Monahan's primary duty consisted of assisting all matters pertaining to the 45 enlisted personnel and offering guidance to the Officer Corps. Senior Chief Monahan was advanced to Master Chief in 2015 and assigned to Aviation Training Center (ATC) Mobile as its Command Master Chief.



Monahan is married to Cindy LaGrone Monahan; together, they have 5 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren.


