

USS Alabama Battleship Commission announces Selection of New Battleship Memorial Park Executive Director

The USS ALABAMA Battleship Commission is pleased to announce that Commander Mark J. Fields, U.S. Navy (Ret.) of Tuscaloosa has been selected as the ninth Executive Director of USS ALABAMA Battleship Memorial Park.

Commander Fields takes the helm effective January 1, 2025. He follows Maj. Gen. Janet L. Cobb, U.S. Army (Ret.), who retires December 31, 2024 after 9 years as Executive Director.

Commander Fields is the current Tuscaloosa County License Commissioner, and past Chief Human Resource Officer for Tuscaloosa County.

As a Naval Surface Warfare Officer, his sea assignments include Anti-Submarine Warfare Officer, USS BRONSTEIN (FF 1037); Damage Control Assistant, USS BUCHANAN (DD 14);

Combat Systems Officer, USS MCINERNEY (FFG 8); Executive Officer, USS PIONEER (MCM 9); and Executive Officer, USS ARDENT (MCM 12). He concluded his service with assignments to the Joint Manpower and Personnel Directorate (J-1) on the Joint Staff and the Naval Sea Systems Command at the Washington, D.C. Navy Yard. In 2007, Commander Fields retired following 20 years of active service.

Maj. Gen. Charles H. Gailes, Chairman of the USS ALABAMA Battleship Commission, commenting on Commander Fields' hiring, said, "His selection as the Executive Director assures us that we have the right person to lead our memorial park. Mark Fields will bring superb leadership and management to the park and a deep sense of commitment to our mission and our park employees. We are very fortunate to have someone of Mark's caliber to occupy this very important position."

South Alabama Veterans Council VETERANS SPOTLIGHT

Major General Janet Cobb US Army (Retired)



Janet Cobb has come a long way from working in the potato sheds of Baldwin County at 14 years old. After graduating from Foley High School, she joined the U.S. Army Reserve. 42 years later, the Commanding General of the 81st Regional Support Command would retire.

She enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve in May 1974 and served until August 1976. She was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in Signal Corps in May 1978 from the University of Alabama ROTC program, where she was named a Distinguished Military Graduate. MG (Ret.) Cobb was the fifty-fourth general officer and the first female general officer to graduate from the University of Alabama. In April 2017, MG (Ret.) Cobb was one of seven selectees for the inaugural University of Alabama ROTC Hall of Fame.

She commanded at the detachment, battalion, brigade, directorate/brigadier general, and major general levels. Her deployments include post-Desert Storm operations at the Ports of Al Jubayl and Ab Dammam, Saudi Arabia, and Operation Iraqi Freedom port operations at the port of Ash Shuyabah, Kuwait (2002-2003).

MG (Ret.) Cobb's additional deployments were joint assignments, where she served as Commander of the 598th Transportation Group (Terminal) (2007) in Rotterdam, the Netherlands, overseeing military ports in Europe and North Africa, and Director of the Central Command Deployment & Distribution Operations Center (Camp Arifjan, Kuwait)(2011), which directed all intra-theater airlift for Iraq and Afghanistan.

MG (Ret.) Cobb was assigned to the Department of the Army Staff as the Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff, G-4, (Mobilization and Training) from 2011-2014. She was mobilized and served in the Pentagon on the Army Staff as Deputy G-4 in 2012. In October 2013, then-Secretary of the Army John Marsh appointed MG (Ret.) Cobb to the Army Reserve Forces Policy Committee for a two-year term.

Her last assignments were as Commanding General of the 81st Regional Support Command at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and Senior Commander of the U.S. Army Garrison at Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico. On August 8, 2016, she retired from the Army of the United States after 42 years in uniform. Her decorations include the Distinguished Service Medal, Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal (3), and various campaign and service awards.

She holds a J.D. from Cumberland School of Law, Samford University, an M.S.S. from the United States Army War College, and a B.A. from the University of Alabama.

Maj. Gen. (ret.) Janet Cobb, JD '84, was inducted into the 2024 Army ROTC Hall of Fame which honors graduates of the Army Reserve Officers' Training Corps who have distinguished themselves in military or civilian pursuits. The Hall of Fame recognizes Army ROTC Alumni who have made lasting, significant contributions to the Nation, the Army and the history and traditions of the Army ROTC.

MG (Ret.) Cobb is a past USS ALABAMA Battleship Commissioner. She serves on the boards of the Historic Naval Ships Association, The Lee Foundation, and the Equine Therapy Group for Veterans. She is a member of the Mobile Bay Area Veterans Commission Board of Trustees and serves on the Veterans Initiative Advisory Council of the Community Foundation of South Alabama. MG (Ret.) Cobb holds a real estate license with the State of Alabama. She is a member of VFW Post 5658, American Legion Post 99, and other professional and civic organizations.

Cobb has announced her retirement on December 31, 2025. In 2015, she became the first woman to serve as Executive Director of the, overseeing the 155-acre property USS Alabama Battleship Memorial Park.

Former Alabama VA commissioner speaks out after being fired by Governor

MONTGOMERY, Ala. (WSFA) - After the Alabama Board of Veterans Affairs voted to keep Kent Davis in his role as the state's veterans affairs commissioner, Gov. Kay Ivey exercised her executive authority to override the board and immediately **terminated** him in October.

"I'm no longer commissioner, and my life has been turned upside down, so this is not going to go away," said former ADVA Commissioner Adm. Kent Davis. Davis says he is now taking legal action against Ivey. "I have been, I think, defamed in public. My family has been affected by this. I'm still recovering from stage three cancer," said Davis.

Alabama's U.S. Representatives Back Bill To Expand Veteran Benefits

The House passed a bill expanding healthcare, housing, education, and support for veterans, which is now heading to the Senate.

On Monday, the House passed a bill that would expand support for veterans, enhance healthcare services and create more opportunities for retired service members in education and the workforce. The bill now heads to the Senate, where its prospects remain uncertain due to the Democratic majority and differing views on the proposed reforms. The legislation, known as the Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, received overwhelming bipartisan approval, passing by a vote of 389-9. Many of the sections in this bill were previously introduced in Congress, such as the similarly named Elizabeth Dole Home Care Act but are now combined under this one comprehensive bill. This bill is a significant win for Republicans, who have raised concerns about the Department of Veterans Affairs and advocated for increased access to at-home care for veterans.
