40th Anniversary of the Wall

THE LEGACY ENDURES

In 1982, when the Vietnam Veterans Memorial was built and dedicated, a promise was made to never forget those who served and sacrificed in the Vietnam War.

This year marks 40 years since that promise was made and The Wall has become the symbol for an enduring legacy of healing, remembrance, and education.

The Reading of the Names — For the 7th time in our history, VVMF will host an in-person event where every single name on the Vietnam Veterans Memorial is read in the order of which it appears on The Wall. As part of the 4oth-anniversary commemoration, the in-person Reading of the Names ceremony will take place in Washington, D.C. at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial and begins on November 7, 2022, at 3:30 p.m. EST. Thousands of volunteers will come to DC to take part in this special event that will end at midnight on November 10, 2022. VVA JOE BIRINDELLI CHAPTER 864 A BRIEF HISTORY

The idea of a VVA chapter for our county came about due to the Lower Alabama Vietnam Memorial. This Memorial was an effort of love that had been started several years before I and others became involved in making it a reality. One by one, veterans from Korea, Vietnam, and even some came together to work on this remembrance of those Vietnam Veterans who gave all from our state and the adjoining counties of Mobile and Baldwin. Yes, young veterans helping the older veterans to build this special place of remembrance.

As we worked together through the week and on Saturday - as well as some Sunday work we talked. During one of these discussions, we realized that many of us who were taking time to get this most worthwhile project completed were from Baldwin County. The talks evolved into a full discussion about starting a VVA chapter in our county. Due to the support of our Mother Chapter, VVA Chapter 701, Mobile, Alabama,

and especially Tom Schwarz, President, we began the process founding of our chapter. The point of the spear of this project was Tom Schwarz and Joe Birindelli. Although we were all involved, it was these two veterans who took the bull by the horns.

The years of 1997 and 1998 would prove to be two years of hard work, disappointments, and a lot of tears as just we who served talked and remembered after a long day's labor about our friends who never came home from 'Nam. We shared mountain-top experiences and finally, a successful crossing of the finish line as our chapter came together.

As far as I can determine the first "unofficial meeting" of VVA 864 was held on November 17, 1999. We met at the VFW on Helen Street in Fairhope, Alabama.

Tom Schwarz, President of VVA Chapter 701, was present and offered any assistance to the group that he or our mother chapter could give to us as needed.

Our charter would be presented in October 1999. President Birindelli and VVA Chapter 701 President Tom Schwarz would be attending the Alabama State Veterans Council Meeting in Birmingham to receive the chapter charter.

Our new chapter was officially named: Vietnam Veterans of America Chapter 864. In February 2018, the chapter was renamed: Vietnam Veterans of America Joe Birindelli Chapter 864. We have seen our membership grow from the original charter members (23) to our current membership as of this date (October 2019) 69. We have also had the honor of adding members of the Associates of Vietnam Veterans of America to our ranks

Our chapter meetings are held every 4th Tuesday at 1400 Hours (2:00 P.M.) of the month, January - October. We encourage anyone who desires to join us for a pre-meeting social ("Meet and Eat") at Café' Acadiana which is located on County Road 104 in Silverhill, Alabama. We welcome everyone who has the desire to attend our chapter meetings. Those Veterans who served our nation between February 28, 1961 - May 7, 1975 (Boots on the ground and "in country"), and any duty station between August 6, 1964 - May 7, 1975 qualify as Vietnam Veterans. The cost of life membership is \$100.00. Our chapter pays for the VVA and AVVA Life Membership Fee.



The Jackson (LCS 6) is the third ship in the Independence-class littoral combat ships and the first ship in the United States Navy named for Jackson, Mississippi. Construction began on August 1, 2011, with the first cutting of aluminum at Austal USA's Modular Manufacturing facility in Mobile, Alabama.

The littoral combat ship Jackson wrapped up its initial deployment — to U.S. 7th Fleet — this month, carrying out manned-unmanned operations with the MQ-8C Fire Scout.

But after returning to its homeport in San Diego Oct. 15, the Jackson's days may be numbered.

Although Navy leaders plan to have more littoral combat ships operating in the Pacific over the next several years, the service's 30-year shipbuilding plan calls for decommissioning the Jackson in 2024.

The event, scheduled for Nov. 14, will bring together thousands of human resources specialists with medical center leaders to "push packages through" for individuals who have already been hired to fill key staff roles but have not yet completed requirements to start working, according to <u>Dr. Shereef Elnahal</u>, VA Under Secretary for Health.

The GST is one of 3 Special Teams that make up the National Strike Force. It is a vital national asset comprised of a unique, highly trained cadre of Coast Guard professionals who maintain and rapidly deploy with specialized equipment and incident management skills at any time to any place or hazard.

The GST is recognized worldwide as an expert authority in the preparation for and response to the effects resulting from oil discharges, hazardous substance releases, weapons of mass destruction events, and other emergencies on behalf of the American public.

After Air Force takes hard line on PME, tech sgt. promotion eligibility nosedives



The number of airmen eligible for promotion to technical sergeant plummeted in 2017 to 25,552 - a decline of roughly 8,000-airman decline compared to the previous year, and the lowest eligibility in decades.

The previous record low for tech sergeant eligibility was in 2003, when 32,501 E-5s were considered for promotion. And for the past decade, at least 34,000 E-5s have been eligible for promotion each year.




Please join Team RWB members from all over the country on Sunday, November 13 at the Battleship 12K. We will be available after the race to answer any questions concerning the organization.
