What is a QR Code and how does it Work?



It is a machine-scannable image that can instantly be read using a Smartphone camera. Every QR code consists of a number of black squares and dots which represent certain pieces of information. When your Smartphone scans this code, it translates that information into something that can be easily understand by humans.

The quick response, or QR, Code is a two-dimensional version of the Barcode able to convey a wide variety of information almost instantly with the scan of a mobile device.

Able to store up to 7089 digits or 4296 characters, including punctuation marks and special characters, the Code can equally encode words and phrases such as internet addresses. One thing to always keep in mind, especially when it comes to designing the Static QR Codes aesthetic is that the more data is added, the more the size increases and its structure becomes more complex.

Even when damaged, the QR Code's structure data keys include duplications. It is thanks to these redundancies that allow up to 30% of the Code structure to take damage without affecting its readability on scanners.

CLAIMS REPRESENTATION AND COUNSELING Veterans Service Offices

The Alabama Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) has veterans service offices located in 60 counties throughout the State of Alabama. The primary function of the ADVA service offices is to assist veterans, their dependents, and survivors in the application and processing of claims for benefits and entitlements available from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the benefits provided for veterans by law from the State of Alabama earned by honorable service in the armed forces of the United States.

Services include the processing of compensation and pension applications; appeal VA decisions; file for survivors death benefits; apply for aid and attendance and housebound benefits; certification of claim documents; request for military service records; upgrade military discharges; apply for special veteran license plates.

ADVA veterans service officers are accredited to perform claims actions by nationally chartered veterans service organizations to include the American Legion, American Ex-Prisoners of War, Fleet Reserve Association, and Blinded Veterans Association.

- Two years (24 months) of completed employment as a Line Cook or higher position. Successful completion of an Advanced Culinary Course.
- Previous U.S. military experience in Culinary (Pay grade E-6 or above with at least one Culinary tour of not less than 24 months in a Lead Foodstervice Production Capacity. The U.S. military service must have been within five years. The candidate may exceed this five-year requirement if continuously employed in a food service capacity. Current US. Armed Forces Food Safety/Sanitation Supervisor Course
- Annual 4-hour Sanitation course.
- on official letter head, form, or evaluation from current or previous employer that describes sperience related to these duties. Document must include company name, applicant's name, and name with signature of company/agency official.



Work Opportunity Tax Credit - WOTC

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) is a federal tax credit available to employers who invest in American job seekers who have consistently faced barriers to employment. Employers may meet their business needs and claim a tax credit if they hire an individual who is in a WOTC targeted group.

Employers must apply for and receive a certification verifying the new hire is a member of a targeted group before they can claim the tax credit. After the required certification is secured, taxable employers claim the WOTC as a general business credit against their income taxes, and tax-exempt employers claim the WOTC against their payroll taxes. WOTC is authorized until December 31, 2025 (Section 113 of Division EE of P.L. 116-260 - consolidated appropriations Act, 2021).

- Lower Alabama Vietnam Veteran Memorial Wall constructed 1998 and Dedicated 9 Nov 1999.
- Construction guided by Vietnam Veterans of America 701 and 864 with help of many others.
- One Wall has the names of 1213 Alabama Fallen and other 178 from Mobile Baldwin Counties.
- Cost for the Memorial Walls was \$175,000. Money from donation and sale of Bricks, T-shirts, etc.
- Statue holding the dog-tags looking at those who gave all—it is called "REMEMBERING."
