
Hello Friends and Fellow Veterans!

Captain Hal dedicated his life to military, community, and veterans' causes. His dedication benefited groups such as the Mobile Propeller Club, Navy League, Symphonic Pops Band, Lighthouse Association, South Alabama Veterans Council, and the American Legion Veterans Commission.

His efforts to restore the Middle Bay Lighthouse lasted over 30 years. He arranged visits for more than 100 Navy ships at Mobile Port, allowing residents to tour. He served on the USS Alabama Battleship Commission, having been appointed in 2002, a proud achievement. His greatest commitment was to South Alabama Veterans, who benefited from his dedication.


