



Carico is the founder and director of Alabama (AL) VeterannatioN a 501 C/19 nonprofit organization that is an advocate for Alabama's Veteran community.

Troy Carico, a 100% service-connected disabled U.S. Army combat veteran, is a highly decorated officer and thought leader. A frequent contributor to 1819 News-Alabama and a regular guest on news talk shows and podcasts, he specializes in innovative strategies and scalable solutions for global security and critical infrastructure. Recently, Troy served as Deputy CIO and IT Contracts Branch Chief at the U.S. Mint, as well as Terminal Manager for UPS International Heavy Freight. From 2009 to 2011, he served as the G2 Chief of Intelligence and Security and the G₃ Deputy of Plans and Operations for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Transatlantic Division, where he developed the acclaimed USACE TAD G2 Intelligence Fusion Center, with over 22 years of Army service, including roles as an infantry soldier (11B) and officer (11A) in counterintelligence (35E) and military intelligence (35D).

Troy served on numerous covert assignments as a civilian intelligence officer for the Defense Intelligence Agency (Great Skills) and with the elite Iraqi Survey Group (2003-2005). A native of Dayton, Ohio, Troy holds a B.S. in Political Science and Military Science from Ball State University and an M.A. in International Relations from the University of Mississippi.

Now focused on veteran advocacy through Alabama Veteran Nation, Troy is rallying the state's 444,000 veterans into a unified political voice. His investigation into misused suicide prevention funds underscores the urgent need for veteran leadership in policy decisions.

Before entering the mortgage industry, Ross proudly served as a **Staff Sergeant in the United States Air Force**, conducting **aeromedical evacuations** and later serving as the **Wireless Manager for U.S. Special Operations Command**.

Following his military service, Ross continued his commitment to public service as a **Special Agent** with the **Federal Investigative Services** branch of the federal government. Nearly eight years ago, he took a leap of faith and transitioned into the mortgage industry — a decision that allowed him to combine his passion for helping others with his dedication to integrity and service.

Ross is a recognized expert in **VA Home Loans** and is deeply committed to ensuring our nation's heroes receive the care and representation they deserve—well beyond the transaction itself. His unwavering advocacy for veterans drives his daily mission to provide **accurate and reliable guidance to** both homebuyers and homeowners.

As a respected business professional, Ross believes in leading with purpose and lifting others along the way. He serves as a **Board Member of the Eastern Shore Chamber of Commerce** and is an **alumnus of Leadership Baldwin**. SAVC presented a grant to IGY6 Gulf Coast to help them reach their goal of raising \$8,000 for Crisis Intervention Training (CIT) for local police departments.

Every dollar contributes to training officers to respond to mental health crises with empathy, skill, and confidence — saving lives and protecting the community. Together, we can provide those who serve with the tools they need to make a lasting impact on the Gulf Coast.

When IGY6 reaches this year's goal:

- 3 departments along the Gulf Coast will receive funded Crisis Intervention Training.
- Over 60 officers will be trained in mental health awareness, communication, and deescalation.
- Those officers will collectively respond to 10,000+ calls per year, meaning lives will be changed — and saved — through this training.

Operation Iron Ruck (OIR) is an annual event hosted by the Auburn Student Veterans Association (ASVA) and the University of Alabama Student Veterans of America (SVA) to raise awareness and funds for veteran suicide prevention. As the state of Alabama has one of the nation's highest veteran suicide rates, OIR seeks to increase the public's knowledge on this issue while uniting veterans with the community, funding charities, championing veteran suicide education and supporting local veteran organizations.

Operation Iron Ruck is a 151-mile ruck between the University of Alabama campus in Tuscaloosa, AL and the Auburn University campus in Auburn, AL. The ruck ends at the stadium of the home team each year. For the safety of our participants, the route was chosen to reflect the quickest, safest, non-interstate path.

The three-day ruck can be a big time commitment, especially when it means being away from family on Thanksgiving. Each year during the ruck, they take a six-hour break to enjoy a Thanksgiving meal together as a team. This year, Thanksgiving dinner will be held at Marbury High School in Deatsville, AL.

FAIRHOPE VETERANS DAY PARADE

The City of Fairhope will honor our military veterans with the annual Veterans Day Parade on Saturday, November 8th, beginning at 10 a.m. from the Fairhope Civic Center. The parade will feature local veterans' organizations, military vehicles, the Fairhope High School Band, and the Daphne High School ROTC.

Leading this year's procession will be Fairhope's 2025 Veteran of the Year. Before the parade, a light breakfast will be served at 8:30 a.m. in the Civic Center lobby for all veterans and parade participants.

MEDAL OF HONOR PARK – Mobile, AL

Chaplain Kyle Beshears, USN, is working to get a flag placed at Medal of Honor Park, Mobile, in honor of John New, PFC USMC. The park first opened in 1996.

Medal of Honor Park, located at 1711 Hillcrest Rd in Mobile, is a vibrant and expansive recreational area that serves as both a community hub and a living memorial. Spanning 133.5 acres, the park offers a diverse array of amenities and activities, making it a popular destination for both locals and visitors.

The park's transformation from Cottage Hill Park to Medal of Honor Park in August 2001 was a significant event, honoring the extraordinary bravery of Private First-Class John D. New, a Mobile native who posthumously received the Medal of Honor during World War II.

On September 25, 1944, while serving on Peleliu Island, he sacrificed his life to save his fellow Marines. When a Japanese soldier threw a grenade into their observation post, New unhesitatingly threw himself upon the explosive, absorbing the full impact and saving the lives of two observers. His valor earned him the nation's highest military honor, and the renaming of the park serves as a lasting tribute to his sacrifice and the values of courage, duty, and selfless service.




