Did vou know? MCPSS's Leadership Officer Training Corps Program (LOTC), launched in 2023 at seven middle schools, has been expanded to include eight more middle schools this fall. The program features drone and robotics competitions, career overviews, field trips to local businesses and industries, and orienteering skills development. The participating MCPSS middle schools are Alba, Burns, Calloway-Smith, Causey, Chastang-Fournier K-8, Grand Bay, Hankins, Lott, Mobile County Training, North Mobile K-8. Pillans. Scarborough, Semmes. Washington, and Williamson. Interested parents can contact their child's school for more information.

Mobile County Public School System held its first LOTC STEM Leadership Academy Camp in Mobile, Alabama. The two-day camp ran from May 1 to June 2, 2025, with all 15 Mobile County public middle schools participating in LOTC. Hosted by Bishop State Community College and Mattie T. Blount High School JROTC, the camp featured engaging, carefully planned learning activities.

The curriculum included leadership development and STEM learning through hands-on experiments at Bishop State Downtown campus. The STEM Academy allowed Cadets to see STEM content and technology in action while working with scientists and engineers, solving local industry and community problems. Cadets observed a variety of STEM activities and their impact on industry. They also collaborated in teams to create, test, and improve solutions for a STEM-focused engineering project, fostering their awareness of STEM careers, the necessary skills, and related college opportunities.

Congratulations to Blount, Bryant, Davidson, and Murphy High School JROTC programs within the Mobile County Public School System, each of which had a cadet receive the 2024-2025 National Army or Navy ROTC Scholarship this past school year.

Montford Point Marine Corporal Lewis Charles Malone




In 1943, at 18, Lewis Charles Malone became one of the first African Americans to join the US Marine Corps and complete basic training at the then segregated boot camp at Montford Point Camp, outside of Camp Lejeune, North Carolina.. He was deployed to the South Pacific, where he participated in the Battle of Iwo Jima, sustaining a wound. In 1945, his unit returned to Oceanside, California, and later Camp Lejeune, North Carolina, before he was honorably discharged as a Corporal on February 1, 1946.

CPL Malone received the Congressional Gold Medal in 2015 during the Montford Point Marines' 50th National Convention in Mobile, AL. He joined the NMPMA, Mobile Chapter #33, on April 29, 2017. He was awarded the Special President's Award and was recommended for the NMPMA Inc. Gold Card Member in 2024. On his 102nd birthday, March 15, 2025, Corporal Malone received the "Centenarian Award."

Mr. Malone, a civilian, served in various roles, including Vocational Teacher, Assistant Principal, Assistant Coach, and Principal. After retiring from education, he founded two construction companies— Malone Land Development and Clark-Monroe Development—building city halls, churches, homes, community buildings across Mississippi, Florida, and Georgia. He also worked as a Supervisor for Scott Paper Company, coordinating around 80 construction firms in New York and North Carolina. Now retired, he stays active in the church as a Deacon Board leader, Assistant Sunday School Supervisor, Trustee, and Bible School teacher. In 2007, he authored and revised a Deaconship book, which was adopted in 27 states and released in December 2014.

At the Montford Point Marine Association's 60th National Convention this year, Corporal Malone was inducted into the Hall of Fame (class of 2025).

MORE HISTORY OF THE SOUTH ALABAMA VETERANS COUNCIL AND THE MOBILE BAY AREA VETERANS COMMISSION.

There is a YouTube video about our founder, Glenn Frazier, which highlights his survival of the Bataan Death March, his time as a forced laborer in Japan, and his struggles upon returning home.

Glenn was promoted to colonel in the Alabama State Defense Force, now known as the United States National Reserve Corps. Glenn believed better communication was needed among veterans' groups due to scheduling conflicts. He thought a "Council" of these groups, led by a board of directors, could be effective. The first meeting of the SAVC was at American Legion Post 88 in August 1998. Glenn's vision has helped veterans for 27 years. Pat Downing, Col USA (Ret) has been SAVC vice-president since May 2016, succeeding Ray Chambless, who died in April 2016.

In August 2004, the Veterans Commission, Veteran of the Year Committee met to decide between Glenn Frazier and James F. Drake, both Bataan Death March survivors, for Veteran of the Year. The high scores were tied, and traditionally, a coin flip would decide the outcome, with the chairman calling the toss. However, Col. Ron Noland suggested both be honored, proposing an entrance with Glenn pushing James in his wheelchair. Both men endured brutal atrocities, survived, and served their communities and veterans for years.

The committee unanimously voted to honor both as 2005 Veterans of the Year. During the luncheon at the Riverview Hotel in Mobile, their names were announced, and Glenn pushed James in, causing emotional reactions among attendees, many of whom shed tears. That is why there are two Mobile Bay Area Veterans of the Year for 2005.

Bataan Death March Survivors



James F. Drake: Mr. Drake enlisted in the Army Air Corps in 1937 on his 18th birthday and had his basic training in the Panama Canal Zone where he was trained as a cook. His specialty was baking—cakes, pies, and cookies.

After being transferred to Barksdale Field, LA his unit was shipped out to Nichols Field, Manila, Philippines. He was promoted to Tech Sergeant, and while serving there his unit was

captured by the Japanese. His unit and thousands of American servicemen were subjected to beatings, torture, malnourishment, and then the horrendous Bataan Death March.

Mr. Drake has been active in veteran organizations and activities locally, and was prominent in his involvement in the "Welcome Home Desert Storm" celebration. Before failing health began to limit his mobility, he was an active member of the Purple Heart Association, Disabled Veterans, Ex-Prisoners of War, and the American Legion. Mr. Drake holds an honorary rank of Colonel at the 3rd Brigade, Alabama State Defense Force.

Mr. Drake's Medals and Awards include: American Ex-Prisoner of War, Purple Heart Medal, Bronze Stare Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Philippine Defense Medal, South Pacific Campaign Medal, Air Force Meritorious Achievement Medal, Military Merit Medal, Philippine Liberation Medal, and Combat Infantry Badge. On 20 August 2000, Mr. Drake was inducted into the Alabama Military Hall of Honor at the Marion Institute, AL.

In 2007, Glenn wrote and published "Hell's Guest," a book recounting his experiences during World War II. He touched many lives with his confessions of forgiveness, which he credited to his later happiness in life gained through his strong Christian faith.



Glenn D. Frazier: Mr. Frazier enlisted in the U. S Army, July 3, 1941 and was discharged July 16,1945 after serving in the Philippine Islands with the 75th Ordinance Company in depot and supply services to the Philippine

Army. While included in the massive surrender of U S Forces to the Japanese, he was subjected to repeated beatings, abuse and forced into the Bataan Death March. Those servicemen that stumbled or could not keep up were often shot or

stabbed with bayonets and left to die. He survived the march but was later subjected to slave labor in Japanese work camps.

Mr. Frazier has numerous military decorations and awards, to include the Combat Infantry Badge, Bronze Star, Purple Heart (4 awards), Presidential Citations from both US and Philippines, Prisoner of War Medal, Philippine Defense Medal, Liberation of the Philippines Medal, Good Conduct Medal, and the US Senate Medal of Freedom.

Subsequent to his Active service, Mr. Frazier served six years in the Army Reserve. He has served in several veterans organizations and in numerous capacities; currently serving as the Commander of the Mobile Chapter, American Ex-POWs. He is also the Public Affairs Officer for the 3rd Brigade, Alabama State Defense Force.



Gentiva Hospice Hosts Coffee & Conversations for Veterans


