2022 Sports Extravaganza – At ParaSport Jam

A small, but mighty band of Lions and community volunteers supported the 2022 Sports Extravaganza held at 'ParaSport Jam' with Kid-netics games on Friday and Saturday, May 6 and 7, 2022 at Coppell High School.

This is the first ever combined sport event organized by the Lions Clubs of Districts 2-X1 and 2- E2 with the Region 10 Special Education Center. As you may know, the Sports Extravaganza (for blind and visually impaired K-12 students) is usually held in October while Kid-netic (for disabled children K-5) is held in May, However, due to the pandemic, both 2-X1, 2-E2 and Region 10 SEC agreed to combine the sport events, hence this year's 'ParaSport Jam' in May, which Coppell High School graciously agreed to host.

Since 2008, our Club has sponsored the Sports Extravaganza's Saturday lunch by providing a variety of sandwiches from local restaurants. This year, the 'ParaSport Jam' committee requested we serve hamburgers and hotdogs cooked by the Colleyville Lions Club crew of District 2-E2 to those in attendance. With 5 Lions and 2 community volunteers behind two rows of serving lines, we successfully served about 400 hamburgers and around 200 hotdogs to the hungry athletes, their families and friends, and fellow volunteers from 11:15 AM to 12:45 PM. We appreciate Lions Mickey MacKay, Sheryll McKay, Charlene Vezina, Bob Hodge, Wayne Meachum and Suzanne Duvall who came, setup, served, and cleaned up afterwards. You guys are heroes!
