

IT'S HARVEST TIME - LAST CALL

God is perfectly positioning His children right now for His end time Harvest.

A Holy Spirit invasion.

Invasion can also be described as a takeover. An infiltration. A reclaiming of what rightfully belongs to the Kingdom of God.

Like an orchestra that flows in perfect unison, the musicians must be placed in the correct arrangement. They must be of one accord with not only the conductor but also each other. As a whole, they form the orchestra.

A piano player could not play the violinist's role, and the saxophone player could not play the role of the flutist. That is not their instrument. If they were to position themselves in a place that was not assigned to them the orchestra would not function correctly. The sound would be inharmonious -divided— not whole. (A Kingdom divided cannot stand — *Mark 3:24* If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.)

The conductor of an orchestra is the leader – the head. In reference to an orchestra, Jesus is the conductor and we are the musicians.

The head of the church (his body) is Jesus Christ and together we form the body.

Jesus Christ is returning for A BRIDE, not BRIDES. One Bride, His Body (church), unified and hidden with Christ in God. Although we are many parts that form one body (with Christ as the head) we are designed to operate in unity and harmony through the Holy Spirit.

Let the Holy Spirit prepare you for the position He has created and designed specifically for you. You are a body part that forms part of the body (church). You have a role to play in the Kingdom of God. You are a child of God and you have been designed specifically for this moment in time.

The Father is calling you into position. Will you come and meet with Him today?

Matthew 11:12 From the days of John the Baptist until now the kingdom of heaven suffers violent assault, and violent men seize it by force [as a precious prize].

Colossians 1:18 Christ is also the head of the church, which is his body. He is the beginning, supreme over all who rise from the dead. So he is first in everything.

Ephesians 1:22-23 God has put all things under the authority of Christ and has made him head over all things for the benefit of the church. And the church is his body; it is made full and complete by Christ, who fills all things everywhere with himself.

1 Corinthians 12:12-27 Unity and Diversity in the Body

Just as a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles,

slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many.

Now if the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," it would not for that reason stop being part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the sense of hearing be? If the whole body were an ear, where would the sense of smell be? But in fact God has placed the parts in the body, every one of them, just as he wanted them to be. If they were all one part, where would the body be? As it is, there are many parts, but one body.

The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!" And the head cannot say to the feet, "I don't need you!" On the contrary, those parts of the body that seem to be weaker are indispensable, and the parts that we think are less honorable we treat with special honor. And the parts that are unpresentable are treated with special modesty, while our presentable parts need no special treatment. But God has put the body together, giving greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.

Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it

Romans 12:4-5 For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.

Colossians 3:3 For you died to this life, and your real life is hidden with Christ in God.
