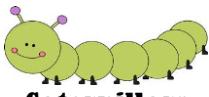

Throughout both months we'll continue our work on writing numbers & letters as well as practicing simple addition & subtraction. We'll study the numbers 11-15, and we'll focus more on learning how to sound out words. We rocked our first semester, and I can't wait for the beginning of our second. Let's get learning!

Taco Crunch Wrap



Ingredients

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 pkg McCormick® Original Taco Seasoning Mix
- $\frac{3}{4}$ cup water
- 8 burrito size (10-inch) flour tortillas
- Tortilla chips (your favorite brand and flavor)
- 2 cups shredded Mexican cheese blend
- 1 cup shredded lettuce
- 1 cup chopped tomatoes
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sour cream
- 3 cups low-sodium chicken broth
- 1 T oil

Make It

1. Brown ground beef in large skillet; drain. Stir in taco seasoning mix and water; bring to boil. Reduce heat and simmer 5 minutes, stirring occasionally.
2. Place 1 flour tortilla on clean work surface. Spoon about $\frac{1}{4}$ cup of the taco meat onto center of tortilla, spreading into a circle. Sprinkle with 2 tablespoons of the shredded cheese. Place 4 to 6 tortilla chips over top. Layer with 2 tablespoons of each cheese, lettuce, and tomato. Top with 1 tablespoon sour cream. Fold edges of tortilla up and over top of filling to enclose. Repeat with remaining ingredients to make 8 crunch wraps.
3. Heat oil in large skillet on medium heat. Working in batches, please wraps in skillet folded side down. Cook 1 to 2 minutes on each side until lightly browned and crispy, adding additional oil as needed. Cut in half and serve with additional toppings such as guacamole, hot sauce, and salsa, if desired.
