



**Everyone** 



The Caterpillar, Butterfly, and Wild Ones rooms will continue to enjoy hearing rhymes and songs with the beat being played on bongos. We have such a great time together during our music time. We will listen to some wonderful, short excerpts of classical music and children's songs while using shakers to play along. Instrument play is probably everyone's favorite part of music class.

The Little Garden, Mickey Mouse Club House, Space, Elephant, and Farm rooms will be using gross motor skills doing a lot of movement to music. We will do a fun jungle version of "The Hokey Pokey," play rhythm instruments to music, and continue working on legato and staccato using scarves and a parachute.

**Pre-K** will prepare for the end of the school year. We will practice a song to perform at graduation, explore playing rhythm instruments, and continue using songs and movement activities about weather while enjoying our time in music class. We will also work on vocal development in a fun way by singing along with the book, "Michael Finnigan".

Kindergarten will also prepare for the end of the school year. We will practice a song to perform at graduation. We will play quarter note and half note patterns with rhythm sticks and triangles, noting that rhythm sticks can be used to play quarter notes and a triangle can be used to play a half note because the sound vibrates. They are showing improvement in inhibitory control by only playing their instrument during a certain part of the song.

# **Crockpot Chicken Tacos**



#### Ingredients

- 2 pounds boneless skinless chicken breasts or boneless skinless chicken thighs
- 1 tablespoon taco seasoning
- 1 cup mild salsa
- for serving: tortillas, shredded cheese, avocado or guacamole, tomatoes, additional salsa, etc.

#### Make It

- Place chicken in bottom of slow cooker. Sprinkle with taco seasoning. Spoon salsa on top of chicken and spread to cover chicken.
- Cook on low for 3 to 4 hours, or on high for 2 hours, until chicken is cooked through. Chicken is done when it registers 165° on an instant read thermometer.
- Remove chicken to a plate to cool slightly. Shred chicken with two forks or your fingers and place in a bowl. Stir in some of the liquid from the slow cooker, starting with ½ cup and adding more as desired.
- Serve chicken in tortillas with toppings as desired.
