Please send your child to school prepared and ready to go EACH and EVERY day. This includes but is not limited to diapers, wipes, water cup/bottle, extra clothes, and ice packs in lunches. We cannot care for your child without the proper supplies. Also, the children notice when they don't have something that their friends do; they feel left out. Unfortunately, because many parents do not follow or simply ignore our requests and reminders, we will begin adding fines to accounts if a child is missing an item. These fines will range from \$1 -\$5/day depending on the necessity of the item. Please help us help your child.

Please always place an ice pack in your child's lunch box!

Medicine Guidelines

If you would like for us to give your child medicine while he/she is at school, please be sure to send the medicine in the original packaging. Be sure to also

include a medicine cup or syringe so we can measure the medicine correctly. Also, we will



not administer any medicine "just because" or "just in case"; a child needs to exhibit some symptoms before we give him/her medicine.

No One Likes to Do It But It Has to Be Done

Both State Licensing and the Health Department require that all food and personal items be labeled with the owner's first and last names. All homemade food items must also include the date it will be consumed. Please help us follow these rules by labeling all your child's things. We don't like getting "in trouble"!

Ms. Lupita & Ms. Jeanine 6 months – 12 months



* February 14th is Valentine's Day! We will be making Tie Dye T-shirts (No supplies needed) and we will be having some yummy treats for snack! *

Please be on the lookout for notes going home to confirm dates and details about our "Special Dates". Thank you for all your support. We will continue to learn and have fun in order to make this year the best it can be!



Happy New Year! Now that the holidays are over, it's time to jump right back into learning. We'll start January with a week of review as a little refresher, just to make sure we're back on track. After that, we blow right into our week about weather. We'll start tracking our daily weather and learning how to predict what the next day might bring. We'll also be talking about what clothing is appropriate for different kinds of weather. Mid-January, I'll begin assigning simple homework once or twice a week. Throughout January, we'll be learning about jobs & income as well as needs vs wants. The third week of the month will be focused on persuasive text and, since that week includes Martin Luther King Day, we'll be using a few of his speeches as examples. The last week of January will be focused on community helpers. We'll be talking about why people have jobs and the different types of jobs that can be found at home, in school, and in the community. We leap right into February with a week all about our 5 senses! We'll be using them to begin learning how to do (simple) research and how to read a map. Our second week begins with our 100th day of school! It's hard to believe we've reached that many days already. During this week, we'll begin learning about historical figures and patriotic holidays. We'll also be introducing 3-D shapes. The third week of February is a bit short due to Presidents' Day, but we'll continue focusing on historical figures. We'll also be talking about repeating patterns in the natural world (such as seasons, day/night, etc.). The last week of February, we'll be learning about Texas! We'll also begin learning how to differentiate between living and non-living things and compare 2-D & 3-D shapes. Throughout both months, we'll be continuing our work on writing numbers & letters as well as simple addition. We've moved on to numbers 11-15 and we'll be focusing harder on learning how to sound out words. We rocked our first semester and can't wait to begin our second. Let's get to learning!

Noteworthy News Mrs. Joanna Everyone



The Caterpillar, and Circus Rooms have been enjoying our time together in music. I get a lot of smiles when I sing old children's folk songs while playing the bongos to help reinforce steady beat. As usual, their favorite part of class is getting the chance to explore the shakers to classical music and fun children's tunes. The Bumblebee, Jungle, Fish, and Farm Rooms are exploring music by pretend play using different forms of transportation. We are focusing on concepts such as fast and slow and up and down. The children are getting a chance to sing a song while playing shakers, practicing using their voices by imitating sounds, and work on gross and fine motor skills by dancing and doing movements to songs and rhymes. The **Pre-K** classes are working on using their singing voices as well as singing while playing rhythm sticks to practice keeping a steady beat. We are also focusing on active listening and listening to music to act out a song. We will also be learning the music term staccato (short and choppy) and applying that by using our voices to sing and rhythm sticks and shakers. The students will learn a few words in sign language to use in singing a song.

Kindergarten is working on playing rhythms with rhythm sticks by reading short music note patterns. So far they have learned what a quarter note and quarter rest are and their value. They will be learning about whole notes and half notes as well. They will learn how to play Do, Re, and Mi on a small xylophone and have a great time singing the "Do-Re-Mi Tapping Song," using their whole bodies to show the steps they make in music. They have been getting more familiar with quarter notes and quarter rests by playing rhythm patterns containing these notes with and without music.

Cheesy Pepperoni Buns



Ingredients

- 1-pound lean ground beef
- 2 c. pizza sauce or pasta sauce
 1 package (3 ¹/₂ ounces) sliced
- 1 package (3 /2 ounces) sheed pepperoni, chopped
- 4 slices American cheese, chopped
- 12 mini buns, split
- 2 c. shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese

Make It

- Heat oven to 350°F. In a large skillet, cook beef over medium heat until no longer pink, 5-7 minutes, breaking into crumbles; drain. Stir in pizza sauce, pepperoni, and American cheese. Cook and stir until cheese is melted, 4-5 minutes.
- Place buns on a baking sheet, cut sides up. Spoon meat mixture onto buns; top with mozzarella cheese. Bake until cheese is melted, about 5 minutes. If desired, serve with additional warmed pizza sauce.
