



Hello! We've had a great year so far! With the introduction of behavior logs at the start of the year, I've seen some positive changes in behavior. The Farmers are doing an excellent job recognizing some sight words as well. I've also discovered that some of them can even read. That's exciting! In addition, I've seen some massive improvements in their writing skills. We started tracing our names at the beginning of the year and, now, some of the children can write their first and last names without needing to trace the letters. We've also been working on letter, number, color, and shape recognition daily. We're even doing these in Spanish. Surprisingly, the children do well in both languages. Our circle time routine also includes reciting the days of the week and months of the year. I find that the songs we sing to remember really do help! The children are getting a lot better at being able to tell me what day of the week it is. The farmers have started to take on some bigger responsibilities in the room. I am requiring them to remember to put everything exactly where it came from and to keep the classroom neat and orderly. Along with these organizational tasks, the children have also started setting out their own lunches, with some assistance of course. Since the academic year will be over in a few months, I want to make sure all of the farmers are prepared for Pre-K so they can excel as I know they are all so capable of. The objectives in March will be the five senses, insects, St. Patrick's Day, and Texas History Month. We will conclude the month with our last four letters. In April, we will focus on spring, recycling, weather, and gardening. We will also add five new sight words to our growing list. We will begin our review time in April as well, to be reminded of all the new things we learned throughout the year. For a more detailed idea of what we will be doing throughout the months, come by the Farm Room and see our monthly newsletter posted on our door.



Howdy, Partner! We can't believe March is here and spring is on its way. Along with that, it's rodeo time in Texas. Yee-haw! We will start off the month learning about Texas and the state symbols. 

Noteworthy News Mrs. Joanna Everyone



The **Caterpillars, Butterflies, and Circus Room** continue to hear nursery rhymes, folk songs, classical music, children's music, and sometimes popular music. I play a small set of bongos while singing songs to help reinforce the *steady beat*. The babies love exploring with an age appropriate rhythm instrument and sometimes try to play the bongos. Some of the older babies sway or dance to the music. I also interact with each one of them one on one when reciting rhymes which usually leads to giggles.

The Bumblebee, Jungle, Fish, Elephant, and Farm Rooms might not understand music terms at their age but they are being exposed to them when we have music time together. We move along as if we are floating in a boat during the legato (smooth and flowing) refrain of the song, Floating Down the River, and jump around during the staccato (short and separated) verses. We will also practice dynamics (volume of music). We will use a parachute to practice music form and reinforce legato and staccato at the same time. Last month we learned a few words in sign language and we will learn a few more to use when singing some of our songs. I will have the children practice echoing rhythm patterns using quarter notes and eight notes played on a pie pan used as a drum.

The Pre-K classes have learned a few words in sign language that go with the songs we have been learning and singing. They have enjoyed drawing rain as we use our voices to make the sound of rain. We have really had fun using hula hoops and our imaginations to pretend that we are jumping and splashing in mud puddles as we sing along. The children have been taught the music terms staccato (short and separated) and legato (smooth and flowing) and have practiced this by tapping rhythm sticks together and singing "pitter patter" for rain in a staccato way and waving a scarf while singing "ooh ooh" for wind in a legato way. We will work more on vocal development in a fun way by singing along with the book, Michael Finnigan. We will also work on some activities that have instrumental and spoken cues and focus on self-controlled action. "Control of the body is the first kind of the control children have over themselves and is the first step toward the development of internal control or 'selfdiscipline." Dance for Young Children: Finding the Magic in Movement, by Sue Stinson p. 5

Kindergarten has been practicing playing rhythm patterns that use quarter notes (one beat of sound) and quarter rests (one beat of silence) and have added the half note (two beats of sound). They really enjoy using the rhythm sticks and triangle to practice playing rhythm patterns along to music. They will also practice how to determine music form in an A-B-A pattern. We will also review everything we learned over the last nine weeks. After our review, the students will be introduced to the whole note (four beats of sound) and eighth notes (two quick notes that equal one beat) and will practice rhythms using a combination of all the notes we have learned.



Wanted: Water!

Plea: K d your child with a water bottle, thermos, or cup each day. The children keep these handy during the day so they can quickly get a drink if they are thirsty. This is especially true when they are at recess. Playing and working hard makes kids thirsty!

Pudding Face



When your child makes cute and delicious pudding cup faces, he/she has also created edible works of art!

What You Need

- Vanilla, chocolate, or butterscotch pudding mix or pre-made pudding cups
- Candy decorations such as: licorice pieces, raisins, chocolate chips, butterscotch chips, coconut shavings, jelly beans, lifesavers, M&Ms, gum drops, gummy worms, red dots, and sprinkles
- Bowls or small clear plastic cups
- Spoon and butter knife

What You Do

- 1. Tell your child he/she will use candy to create faces on pudding cups, and he/she will get to eat the whole thing!
- 2. Your child can help you make pudding from a box or you can provide pudding already premade purchased pudding cups.
- 3. Have your child use a spoon to scoop pudding into a clear bowl or plastic cup. After the child has filled the bowl, a parent can use a knife to smooth out the surface of the pudding.
- 4. Let your child pick out the decorations that he/she would like to use to create a "face" on the surface of the pudding.
- 5. You may wish to photograph the finished pudding face creation before your child eats it.

Chicken Noodle Casserole I



Ingredients

- 4 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves
- 6 ounces of egg noodles
- 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1 (10.75 ounce) can condensed cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup sour cream
- salt & pepper to taste
- 1 cup crumbled buttery round crackers
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup butter

Make It

- Poach chicken in a large pot of simmering water. Cook until no longer pink in center, about 12 minutes. Remove from pot and set aside. Bring chicken cooking water to a boil and cook pasta in it. Drain. Cut chicken into small pieces and mix with noodles.
- 2. In a separate bowl, mix together both soups and sour cream. Season with salt and pepper. Gently stir together soup mixture and chicken mixture. Place in a 2 quart baking dish.
- 3. Melt butter in a small saucepan, and remove from heat. Stir in crumbled crackers. Top casserole with the buttery crackers.
- 4. Bake at 350° for about 30 minutes, until heated through and browned on top.


