Warmer weather is here! We begin March with a week dedicated to Dr. Suess (his birthday is March 2nd). We'll be focus on and discuss author's purpose and learn a few new vocabulary words. Throughout the month, we'll learn about the basic needs of organisms, with a focus on plants and animals. Since our second week in March is rodeo themed, it'll be a great time to really dive into this using the different kinds of animals that can be found at the rodeo. The last two weeks of March will be centered on family and Easter. We'll be learning about the similarities and differences among people as well as talking about different kinds of family traditions. We'll continue to work on our handwriting and spelling as well as learn about subtraction during our math lessons. We dash right into April with a superhero themed week! We'll be learning about the characteristics of drama and discussing what a main character is. Our second week in April focuses on plants. Noteworthy News Mrs. Joanna All Ages



The **Caterpillars, Butterflies, and Circus Room** will continue to hear nursery rhymes, folk songs, classical music, children's music, and popular music. I play a small set of bongos while singing songs to help reinforce the *steady beat*. The babies will continue exploring with an age-appropriate rhythm instrument and even the bongos.

Bumblebee, The Jungle, Fish, Elephant, and Farm Rooms will be focusing on tempo (fast and slow). Our lessons have a transportation theme. The children are learning to control and coordinate their body's movements by getting faster or slower and stopping and starting. They are also going to focus on the concept of up and down. Music moves up and down and we will explore that with our bodies and voices singing, (speaking, vocalizing, and listening).

The **Pre-K** classes are learning the music terms, *staccato* (short and choppy) and *legato* (smooth and connected). We are using a weather theme to practice our music concepts. The students are going to learn the American Sign Language signs for stop, rain, rainbow, and wind. We will sing and move with props and with instruments. We will also work on self-controlled action and vocal development.

Kindergarten will continue to work on keeping a steady beat and learn the difference between beat and rhythm. They are getting the chance to pat, clap, and use rhythm instruments to play patterns that include quarter notes and quarter rests. The children have started to learn that music moves up and down like going up and down steps and are beginning to learn songs that contain Do, Re, and Mi patterns. They will learn some simple rhythmic and pitch ostinatos (patterns). The students will learn about the half note (two beats of sound). They will also practice how to determine music form in an A-B-A pattern.

Waffle Iron Pizzas



Ingredients

- 1 package (16.3 ounces) large refrigerated buttermilk biscuits
- 1 cup shredded part-skim mozzarella cheese
- 24 slices of pepperoni (about 1.5 ounces)
- 2 ready-to-serve fully cooked bacon strips, chopped
- Pizza sauce, warmed

Make It

- Roll or press biscuits to fit waffle iron. On 1 biscuit, place ¹/₄ cup cheese, 6 slices pepperoni, and a scant tablespoon of chopped bacon to within ¹/₂ inch of edge. Top with second biscuit, folding bottom edge over top edge and pressing to seal completely.
- Bake in a preheated waffle iron according to manufacturer's directions until golden brown, 4-5 minutes. Repeat with remaining ingredients. Serve with pizza sauce.
