


- Please do not walk on rug with shoes on. Remove shoes at the door or put on shoe covers located inside the door.

- Please read our notes daily on the SmartCare app. This is sometimes our only way to communicate with you if your child needs diapers, wipes, extra clothes, etc. since teachers come and go at different times during the day.

Noteworthy News Mrs. Joanna Evervone



The beginning of May means that we have four weeks of music left until we break for summer. This past school year has been so much fun! I look forward to next school year!

The **Caterpillars, Butterflies, and Circus Room** continue to hear nursery rhymes, folk songs, classical music, children's music, and sometimes popular music. I play a small set of bongos while singing songs to help reinforce the *steady beat*. The babies love exploring with an age appropriate rhythm instrument and sometimes try to play the bongos. Some of the older babies sway or dance to the music. They seem to know when it is music time and are ready for it. I love interacting with each one of them when reciting rhymes which usually leads to giggles from all of us.

The **Bumblebee**, Jungle, Fish, Elephant, and Farm Rooms amaze me with how much information they absorb. We have recently discussed light and heavy sounds and movements. The children have done a great job distinguishing between the two. We had so much fun playing on plastic containers and round metal cake pans as drums and listening to the timbre (tone, sound quality). We will be focusing on energy as we have fun with music. We will work on inhibitory control using our bodies and rhythm instruments and practice more legato and staccato using hula hoops.

The Pre-K classes have done a wonderful job practicing legato and staccato using scarves and rhythm sticks and the parachute. We have also enjoyed singing along to the story of Michael Finnigan. We have acted out the story as we sing it and will use a glockenspiel to make the sound of the wind. We will explore hearing and listening. "Hearing and listening are quite different. Hearing is a process involving nerves and muscles that reaches adult efficiency by age four to five. Listening is a learned behavior, a mental process that is concerned with hearing, attending, discriminating, understanding, and remembering. It can be improved with practice. Listening affects social interactions, one's level of functioning, and perhaps one's overall success in life." (Weiss and Lily-White, 1981). We will also draw to music to see how the dynamics in the music affect each child. Also, playing finger games will help with preparation for playing piano or string instruments.

Kindergarten has been doing so well learning to play rhythms using quarter notes and quarter rests, half notes and half rests, whole notes and whole rests, eighth notes, and sixteenth notes. I am so proud that they can recognize and recall which note is which. We have played some rhythms out of a beginner drumming book on some plastic containers that we have used as drums. The students have practiced reading and playing the rhythms and I am so very proud of how well they have been doing. For the last four weeks of music classes we will be watching the movie musical, *Mary Poppins*. I will explain to them what a musical is and the difference between a movie musical and a stage musical.

I have really enjoyed getting to know and teach your children about music. I will really miss them! I hope that what I have tried to teach them will give them a good foundation for their future music classes in school.



Wanted: Water!

Please send your child with a water bottle, thermos, or cup each day. The children keep these handy during the day so they can quickly get a drink if they are thirsty. This is especially true when they are at recess. Playing and working hard makes kids thirsty!

Put the Chef Hats & Aprons Away

If you provide your child's class with a treat, please remember, per state regulations, we are not allowed to serve the children homemade food items.



Car crashes are a leading cause of death for children ages 1 to 13. That's why it's so important to choose and use the right car seat correctly every time your child is in the car. Make Rice Pictures



This is a fun project that will work on your child's pincer grasp and help prepare him/her for proper pencil holding.

What You Need

- Uncooked rice
- Rubbing alcohol
- Food coloring in several shades
- Glue or rubber cement
- Paper

What You Do

- Color the rice: In a large bowl, mix 1 cup of rice with a ¹/₂ teaspoon of rubbing alcohol and a few drops of food coloring. Lay the rice in a jellyroll pan to dry. (This could take 1 day.) Repeat with as many colors as you'd like.
- 2. Prepare the paper: Draw a basic picture on the paper, using a waterproof marker. Or, if you'd prefer, use a page from a coloring book.
- 3. Glue the rice: Generously paint one area of the picture with glue. Then, show your child how to place the rice, piece by piece, onto it. Until the glue dries completely, the rice will move allowing your child to tweak the picture as needed. He/She can lay the rice in rows or patterns or add the rice in a more impromptu fashion. As your child finishes a section, paint another with glue and continue. Placing the rice down piece by piece is what makes this a small motor activity. If your child gets tired and starts scooping it onto the page, stop and come back to it at another time. When finished, pour a coating of glue over the picture and allow it to dry overnight.

Cheez-It Meatloaf



Ingredients

- 2 lb. ground beef
- 1 c. Cheez-It crackers, crushed
- 2 large eggs
- 1 packet Lipton onion soup mix
- ¹/₄ c. shredded sharp Cheddar

Make It

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°. In a large mixing bowl combine ground beef, crushed Cheez-Its, eggs, and onion soup mix. Use your hands to knead together until thoroughly combined.
- 2. Place the beef mixture in a greased loaf pan and bake until the meat has browned and pulled away from the edges of the pan, about 40 minutes. Top with cheese and broil until melted, about 5 minutes. Courtesy of delish


