Also, do not send your child back to school until he/she is able to follow the regular classroom schedule along with the rest of the class, including going outside. We cannot keep a teacher inside for only one student; this affects our teacher/student ratios. Thank you!

It's Fall, y'all! We're looking forward to some (hopefully) cooler weather to enjoy for recess and I'm sure you are too. We're ready to kick this year into high gear! We

start October talking about colors, colors, colors. We'll be using the book The Crayon Box That Talked by Shane DeRolf to help us focus on our colors and we'll even be creating and coloring our own little mini book! We'll also be spending a lot of time learning about matter and the various properties that it can have (color, shape, temperature, size, weight, texture, and buoyancy). During the second full week, we'll be talking about Christopher Columbus. We'll use some color by number history sheets to help us on recognizing our numbers and we'll even be creating our own little boat using pieces of various shapes and sizes. In science, we'll be learning about heating and cooling and how they can affect different materials. We'll also start talking about chronology (organizing time, days of the week, months of the year) and will continue with that through the end of the month. During the last two weeks of October, we will be talking about creepy crawlies and spooky things. We'll be focusing on fun books and activities that relate to insects, pumpkins, and fun Halloween things. November starts with a trip back to the '50s as we start talking about spatial terms (over/under, near/far, left/right) and relative location. We'll also be practicing our color words using some rockin' jukeboxes. After that, we jump into a week all about Veterans and the military. We'll continue our study of relative location by creating our very own treasure maps! Also, we'll be reading about Gabe the hero dog (he's a bomb sniffing dog) and practicing our counting and addition skills using toy soldiers. For science, we'll be focusing on the way things move (straight line, zigzag, round and round, back and forth, fast and slow) by completing an obstacle course! We'll finish out November with a week all about being thankful. We'll be talking about family and eating healthy as well as all the things we're grateful for. In science we'll learn how to sort rocks by size, shape, color, and texture, as well as learning why rocks, soil, and water are useful to us. We've come a long way in recognizing our letters and are moving right into focusing on letter sounds. We can recognize our shapes and numbers so now we're working on drawing them and spelling out their names. Our handwriting is coming along great, and we make sure to work on it a little bit every day. It's all about practice, practice, practice. We are super excited to see where this year takes us!





The Caterpillars, Butterflies, and Circus Room are learning music using *First Steps in Music* by John M. Feierabend, who is considered one of the leading authorities on music and movement development in childhood. His curriculum consists of traditional folk songs and rhymes, as well as classical music listening.

The **Bumblebees, Jungle Room, Fish, Elephants, and Farmers** are going to be focusing on tempo (fast and slow) and levels (high and low) in October and November. We will do this using rhythm sticks to tap the beat to a song that alternates between duple and triple meter. We will use gross motor skills to explore up and down and use expressive poems to work on fine motor skills. Lessons are repeated two weeks in a row to help the children become familiar with the music and poems and get practice with the concepts they are learning.

The **Pre-K** class has been enjoying our pretend trips to the toy shop each week using fun songs and movement. Each week I sing them a question in a *tritonic* tone. They are getting better at answering me back by singing the answer in a *bitonic* tone. This helps them learn to sing on pitch. We are continuing to work on *dynamics* (loud and soft) and keeping a steady beat.

Kindergarten has been learning music skills using the Classroom Music for Little Mozarts curriculum. We are learning along with our fun, imaginary music friends: Mozart Mouse, Beethoven Bear, and Clara Schumann Cat. We have started learning to identify and play high and low sounds or notes using a children's xylophone and how music goes up and down. We will work on learning about dynamics (how music can be loud and soft) and tempo (how music can go fast and slow). Later, we will review all the skills we have learned up to this point in a fun way. We will also be working on playing a steady beat with rhythm sticks, and the students will learn what a quarter note and quarter rest is and how many beats each gets.





Hi parents! I'm pleased to let you know that we've had a great start to the school year. This year is my first opportunity to work with the two-yearolds in PE, and they've done an awesome job participating in all the activities. My focus for the beginning of the semester is to strengthen hand-eye coordination and develop gross motor skills. Pre-K and Kindergarten are taking part in slightly competitive activities as well. Building teamwork and showing great sportsmanship is something I'm holding the kids accountable to. A few activities we've done so far include soccer, bowling, parachute, bean bag toss, and the older groups have played flag tag Thank you for sending your child to school with tennis shoes on Fridays. We have been accident free! Yay!






Friendly Reminders



Chicken Alfredo Biscuít Bombs



Ingredients

- 1 cup chopped cooked chicken
- 1 cup frozen broccoli florets (from 10-oz bag), thawed and cut into small pieces
- 1 jar (15 oz) Alfredo pasta sauce
- 1 can (16.3 oz) refrigerated flaky layered buttermilk biscuits (8 Count)
- 4 oz block mozzarella cheese, cut into 16 cubes
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup panko crispy breadcrumbs
- 1 tablespoon grated Parmesan cheese
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- Chopped parsley, if desired

Make It

- 1. Heat oven to 375°. Spray 16 regular-size muffin cups with cooking spray.
- In medium bowl, mix chicken, broccoli, and ¹/₂ cup of the Alfredo sauce. Separate dough into 8 biscuits. Separate each biscuit into 2 layers. Press each biscuit layer into 3¹/₂-inch rounds.
- 3. Place a heaping tablespoon of the chicken mixture and 1 mozzarella cube in center of each dough round. Gently stretch dough up and around chicken mixture and cheese, bringing to top, and pinching firmly to seal.
 - In a small microwavable bowl, microwave butter uncovered on high 20 to 30 seconds or until melted. Stir in breadcrumbs, Parmesan cheese, and garlic powder; mix well. Roll each biscuit in mixture, lightly pressing mixture into dough, and place pinched side down in muffin cup. With sharp

knife, poke top of each biscuit 2 times to vent. Bake 19-24 minutes or until golden brown and biscuits are not doughy in center.

 In small microwavable bowl, add remaining pasta sauce. Cover; microwave on high 60-90 seconds, stirring halfway through. Serve warm biscuits with warm sauce for dipping. Garnish with parsley.
