



Crescent Roll Chicken Pot Pie



Ingredients

- 3 T unsalted butter
- 1 onion, diced
- 2 carrots, diced
- 2 stalks celery, diced
- 2 t kosher salt
- 1 T black pepper
- 1 can cream of chicken soup
- ½ cup milk
- 3 cups shredded cooked chicken
- 2 cans refrigerated crescent roll dough (8 ounces each)
- Cooking spray

Make It

- 1. In a large skillet, heat the butter over medium-high heat until it starts to shimmer. Add the onion, carrots, celery, salt, and pepper and cook for 10 to 12 minutes until the vegetables start to soften.
- Add the cream of chicken soup, milk, and cooked chicken and cook until heated throughout and the sauce begins to thicken, about 3 to 4 minutes. Set aside to let cool slightly.
- 3. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.
- 4. Roll out one can of the crescent rolls over the bottom of a greased 13 x 9 baking dish.
- 5. Top with pot pie mixture.
- 6. Unroll the second roll of crescent dough over the top, gently stretching it to the edge of the pan. Spray the top with cooking spray.
- 7. Bake until the top is golden brown, 25 to 30 minutes. Let rest 5 to 6 minutes before serving.
