DID YOU KNOW? Changes that you will observe in the church during Lent

As Jesus relived the life of Israel by fulfilling all that Israel had failed to do, the Church lives the life of Jesus in its liturgical seasons and the Mass. The Church makes changes to the Mass to reflect the liturgical season. What's different in the Mass during Lent? The most notable changes are the colors of the priest's vestments and altar linens (purple symbolizing repentance) and the absence of the Gloria and the Alleluia. The decorations on the altar reflect a more somber atmosphere that helps us to focus on this season for change.

We are on a spiritual journey toward the Second Coming and our eternal life in Heaven. In order to remind us of that journey, the Church, during Lent, removes the Alleluia from the Mass. Instead, we acknowledge our sins and practice prayer, fasting and almsgiving so that one day we may again have the privilege of worshiping God alongside the angels.

The Return of the Gloria and Alleluia at Easter

That day comes triumphantly on Holy Saturday night during the Easter Vigil when the priest or deacon chants a triple Alleluia before proclaiming the Gospel and everyone responds in turn, with a triple Alleluia.

A letter from Most Rev. Gerald F. Kicanas, Bishop Emeritus of Tucson:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

I am deeply grateful for your prayers and expression of concern since my open heart surgery on January 6. It is now six weeks since the surgery and I am beginning to feel much better. I expect to begin cardio-rehab on March 1 at St. Joseph Hospital.

Over these six weeks I have been gifted by the support of so many who spoiled me and have nursed me back to health. I have been reminded of how good people are and how much people are willing to sacrifice to help someone. Dr. Robert Hooker, my surgeon, his medical staff, as well as the health care workers at Banner have been amazing. I have been so blessed.

Bishop Weisenburger has been such a great support, contacting me regularly and providing any support that was needed. We are blessed to have him as our bishop, a pastor who cares. I have been cleared to drive, to travel, and to begin again my ministry for which I am grateful. While further recovery is necessary, I am hopeful the biggest challenge is behind me. The experience of illness and vulnerability is a teaching moment. I hope it has made me more sensitive to the challenges and struggles that people face. I have come to realize more clearly that many are in need of support and care. We are all vulnerable. It is our call to accompany the many people who are suffering and in need. What a privilege is the call we have received to accompany those struggling. Please continue to remember me in your prayers as I will continue to hold you in prayer.

What is Metanoia?

"Metanoia" is a word that is heard a lot in the Greek Bible Translations. Here is a definition: Literally repentance or penance. The term is regularly used in the Greek New Testament, especially in the Gospels and the preaching of the Apostles. Repentance is shown by faith, baptism, confession of sins, and producing fruits worthy of penance. It means a change of heart from sin to the practice of virtue. As conversion, it is fundamental to the teaching of Christ, was the first thing demanded by Peter on Pentecost, and is considered essential to the pursuit of Christian perfection.


