"¡Qué crueldad negarme la comunicación hacia mis hijos!"

- Lourdes, 43 años, madre de 4 hijos y cabeza de familia. Detenida en Tucson y deportada a Nogales, Sonora

Lourdes es madre soltera y proveía para sus 4 hijos. Llevaba 27 años viviendo en Estados Unidos, trabajando en un supermercado en Tucson. Este año, en camino a recoger a su hijo menor de 5 años, quien tiene autismo, paró a poner gasolina cuando dos oficiales con chaleco negro la arrestaron sin motivo alguno y la llevaron a una oficina de ICE. "No me dejaron llamar a la escuela para avisar. ¡Qué crueldad negarme la comunicación hacia mis hijos!"

"Todos estos años he trabajado duro para sostener a mis hijos. Jamás cometí un delito o infracción y mis hijos son ciudadanos. Lo único que me queda es confiar en que Dios los cuide en mi ausencia".

"They denied me any chance to communicate with my children. It was so cruel!" Nogales, Sonora.

Lourdes is a single mother and is the only provider for her four children. She had been living in the United States for 27 years, working at a grocery store in Tucson. This year, on her way to pick up her youngest son, a 5-year old with autism, she stopped to get gas when two officers in black vests arrested her for no apparent reason and took her to an ICE office. "They didn't let me call the school to let them know what was happening. They denied me any chance to communicate with my children. It was so cruel!"

"All these years I've worked hard to support my kids. I have never committed a crime or even a violation, and my children are citizens. The only thing I have left is to trust that God will take care of them while I'm gone."
