## 2024 Eucharistic Congress

Last week the National Eucharistic Congress concluded with a Mass attended by tens of thousands of people. Pope Francis' envoy in attendance relayed that he hopes for this event to lead to "conversion to the Eucharist". Each day the perpetual Eucharistic adoration chapel was filled with people of all ages kneeling and praying in silence. Visitors from all 50 states were in attendance providing for unity within our Church. Every day there were opportunities for Catholics of all backgrounds to pray together and within different rites including the Ruthenian-Byzantine rite, the Traditional Latin Mass, and youth Masses with praise and worship. Bishop Cozzens, who celebrated the concluding Mass shared about the congress, "It has been my experience and I hope yours, that we lived an experience of heaven.
