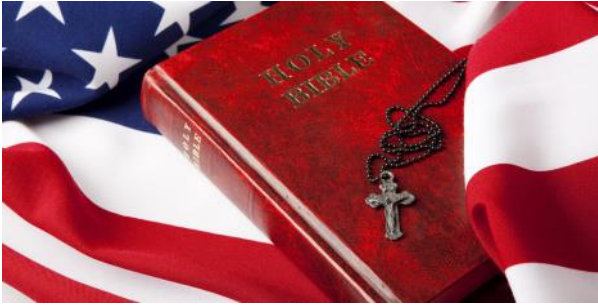

Sacred Heart Document to be released September 2024

While June draws to a close, Pope Francis announced on June 5th he will be preparing a document on the Sacred Heart of Jesus to be released this September. This comes to us during the 350th anniversary year of the first apparition of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque. “I am happy to prepare a document that brings together the valuable reflections of previous magisterial texts and a long history going back to the sacred Scriptures to re-propose today to the whole Church this devotion, full of spiritual beauty,” stated Pope Francis during his general audience on June 5th of this year. “The feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, which the Church is preparing to celebrate in the coming days, reminds us of the need to respond to the redemptive love of Christ and invites us to entrust ourselves with confidence to the intercession of the mother of the Lord. We ask the Lord, through the intercession of his mother, for peace, peace in the tormented Ukraine, peace in Palestine, Israel, peace in Myanmar.”

“We pray that the Lord will give us peace and that the world will not suffer so much from war. May the Lord bless everyone. Amen,” Pope Francis concluded. So as the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus closes, let us continue our devotions and pray for the preparation of this document and all who will encounter it’s loving message. *Quotes taken from Catholic News Agency and U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops.*
