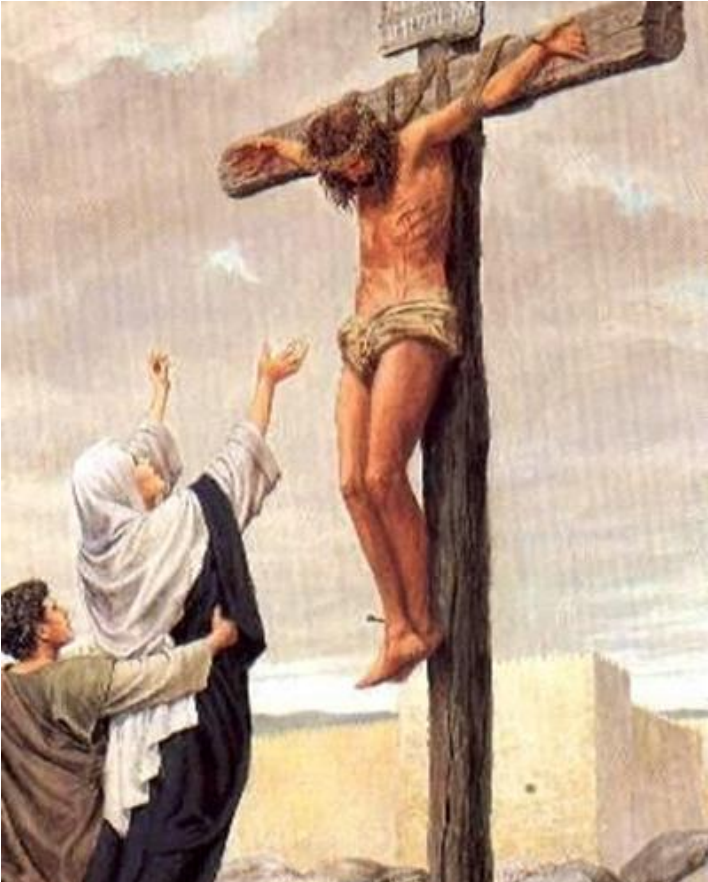

LENTEN INTERESTING FACTS
The Legend of the Dogwood Tree

According to legend, the dogwood was once a tall, mighty tree, taller than any great cedar. Its wood was of the highest quality, hard and sturdy, popular among builders and carpenters for many different purposes. Because of its strength and height, it was chosen for the wood of Jesus' Cross. The dogwood was heartbroken at having been turned to such a wicked purpose. Our Lord, knowing the sorrow of the tree as He hung upon it, blessed the tree in exchange for its devout sorrow for His suffering. The tree would no longer be tall, but short, so it would never again be used for a cross. It would bear a blossom with four petals, in the shape of the Cross, to forever remind men of the sacrifice of Calvary. The edge of each petal would bear a little imprint, tinged with red, representing the four nail-wounds in Christ's hands and feet and His Precious Blood. In the center of the flower would rest a small cluster, reminiscent of His crown of thorns. When you stop to admire a dogwood tree this spring, take a moment to meditate upon the Passion of Jesus, so beautifully illustrated on its lovely blossoms.

FROM BISHOP WEISENBURGER

At this time [February 26, 2022] the protocol recommendations that follow below are largely at the discretion of the Pastor or Parish Administrator. In turn, those in leadership are strongly recommended to check with their local county health department for current COVID-19 recommendations.

The use of facemasks, especially by vulnerable persons or to protect vulnerable persons, is encouraged.

Properly ventilate public spaces.

Social distancing between individuals at Mass and gatherings whenever possible.

Washing hands to reduce chances of passing on contagion.

Parishes are encouraged to offer at least one Mass per weekend following full protocols. (This is the 5:00 Saturday Anticipatory Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes)

People who are not vaccinated but wish to volunteer in public ministries are strongly encouraged to use facemasks. (Those in ministry with minors should be vaccinated.)

Fully vaccinated as well as unvaccinated individuals who are immune compromised, including those undergoing transplant or cancer treatment, should seek the guidance of their clinical care team before discontinuing mask use.

People who are vaccinated and develop symptoms of COVID-19 should get tested for COVID-19. Volunteers who develop symptoms of COVID-19 should withdraw from service until they obtain a negative COVID-19 test and are symptom-free.
