Good day,

My name is Dan Garcia and Fr Martin has asked me to bring you up to date on a few things going on within the Parish.

1st: On July, 22, 2020 the Finance Council and Board of Directors held a joint meeting via Zoom pertaining to Mary's house and unanimously voted to move forward in purchasing it. In conclusion Friday October 9, 2020, Our Lady of Lourdes purchased Mary's house across the street with plans to use it as an office. The existing office will be used for CCD classes and RCIA. The cost including closing cost was \$50,284.21. We met with the Planning & Zoning Commissioner's on September 29th to request changing the zoning from residential to commercial, the public was given a chance to have their voices heard and oppose the change, there wasn't any opposition, all positive. Now we will meet again on October 19th, for the Commissioner's vote, which I believe will pass & the zoning will be granted to commercial. We received quotes to completely revamp the electrical, have AC installed and Fumigate, at a cost of \$24,825. An additional \$4,616 will be needed to make the office ADA compliant. We plan to request a Grant from the Catholic Foundation to help off set some of the costs.

2nd: As some of you may know there was a fire with Fr's next-door neighbor on July 31, 2020, which destroyed the neighbors two sheds and the electric meter servicing the rectory and damaged some trees and shrubs in the Rectory yard. Thanks to Frank Acuna for keeping the fire from reaching the rectory itself, with the use of a garden hose until Benson Fire department could arrive, along with Pomerine, St. David and J-Six. An electrician was called to reinstall a new meter as an emergency, at a cost of \$1,200. We submitted a claim with SSVECOOP, which they denied, but agreed to reimburse the parish half, \$600. The fire brought up some unknown issues, in which correcting them, required two new meters to be installed on the rectory property. One to the rectory and another to the chapel off a new service pole installed in the alley. That cost was \$3,850.

3rd: There was a water service and irrigation lines that required repair at the rectory as well. A ball valve and pressure reducer valve were replaced at a cost of \$535. The leaks were requiring Fr Martin to continuously turn the valve on at the meter when water was needed and then he would need to shut it off, until it was needed again. Now things are working properly at the rectory, thank God.
