

A Litany for Spiritual Care Awareness Week


We pray that each spiritual care provider to know the grace of God in their ministries. May their skill, care, and wisdom be God's grace poured out.

MINUTES OF JUNE 4th MEETING



Meeting held In-Person and by Zoom with 20 people present. Heather opened with a prayer and video on Access Forward as AODA requirements were to be a significant portion of the meeting discussions.

<u>Secretary for Meeting:</u> Nomination for a secretary in the absence of the Deanery Secretary for the purposes of taking minutes. Nomination of Nancy Houghton by Wendy Hogarth, seconded by Ron Algate. No other nominations, carried by acclamation.

<u>Agenda:</u> Moved by John Dunbar, seconded by Brad Burgess, the Agenda be accepted as presented. Carried.

<u>Minutes:</u> Moved by Margaret Morrison, seconded by Jim Schell that the Previous Meeting Summary by adopted as circulated. Carried.

Business Arising: Clarification on Lay Reader vs Lay Leader terminology.





<u>Financial Report:</u> Moved by Wendy Hogarth, seconded by Ron Algate that the Financial Report by accepted as presented. Carried.

NOTES – reminder to everyone that cheques need to be payable to Muskoka Deanery for dues.
Heather was to inform the Treasurers. Upgrading the Deanery account to allow e-transfers would result in a monthly service charge of between \$2 to \$5 depending on the number of transactions, going to maintain the current account. Discussion of the Expense Consideration to reimburse the costs of the BBQ, to a maximum of \$250.00, with the Archbishop on June 1st, 2024. Moved by Lynne Preston, seconded by John Dunbar. Carried.

<u>Archdeacon's Report:</u> Read by Kelly Baetz. Announcement of new Honorary Associate and formal swearing of oath and issuing of license for GailMarie Henderson in Bala, Barkway, Gravenhurst parishes, and announcement of new Honorary Associate Jim Sutton in Parry Sound (issuing of license to be done later as he was not in attendance). Presentation of Diocesan Lay Reader Emertius license to Derek Shakespeare and Diocesan Lay Reader license to Nancy Houghton.

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- Anglican Foundation of Canada Report: Anne Wilson joined the
 meeting at 7:41 pm to talk about the Say Yes to Kids campaign. 33 teams across Canada
 raised money for camps including Gitchigomee, Manitou and Temiskaming. Bursaries are
 used to support Kids and many that have benefitted from bursaries pay it forward.
- Lay Readers: our Deanery hosting the next Diocesan Layreader Conference on Oct. 4 6th, 2024 in Parry Sound. Open to all Layreaders, layreaders-in-training or anyone else interested in finding out more about the Layreader ministry.
 - Anglican Church Women: Deanery President sent her regrets, but the ACW hosted a wonderful Annual Meeting and expressed their thanks to everyone who helped support the Deanery ACW for the meeting.

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Follow-Up from Synod: Resolution #1 from Synod should be a topic of discussion in each parish at Advisory Board/Parish Council meetings; Resolution #2 from Synod – we are still looking for a Muskoka Representative for the Episcopal Endowment Fund Committee; Resolution #3 from Synod – reminder of funds to be put aside for Layreader support in each parish; Resolution #4 from Synod – Communion Forest Initiative – each parish is to undertake at least one initiative before the next diocesan synod. A reminder that there is money available from the Muskoka Ministry Fund which could be used to help with projects for that initiative. Deadline to apply is the end of June.

AODA Requirements: Heather provided a slideshow on AODA. Information is also available on the Provincial Website under Small Business Standards. The final slide was a "To Do" List for 2025.

- 1. Create your Accessibility Policy template will be sent around by Heather
- 2. Create your Fire, Safety and Emergency Plan template will be sent by Heather
- 3. Pursue the items required to accomplish these plans: signage, ramp, large print items, revise volunteer or job descriptions, etc.

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- 4. Train staff and volunteers as required.
- 5. Ensure your Vestry 2025 includes an opportunity to approve the Accessibility Policy and compliance measures.

ARCHDEACON'S REPORT

Dear Members of Deanery Council,



As I write this, it is Thanksgiving Monday, and I am indeed thankful for much, not least of which is the privilege of serving alongside each of you here in the Deanery of Muskoka. I pray you had wonderful Sunday services in your corners, and that you know the power of practicing gratitude not only at Thanksgiving, but every day.

Some of you have likely heard that my husband and I, as well as one of our Deanery Council members James Hunt, were in a car accident while coming home from Provincial Synod. While we all emerged relatively okay, I am taking a few weeks to cut back on my workload and recover (if you've ever had sore ribs, you know where I'm coming from!!). Anglican Foundation of Canada report to Deaneries in the Diocese of Algoma Fall, 2024

The Anglican Foundation of Canada (AFC) continues to work on behalf of across Canada. Since January, the Foundation has distributed more than \$560,000. In the 3rd quarter of the year, \$166,000 went to 12 Dioceses. Dr Scott Brubacher, Executive Director of AFC said, "It was encouraging to see the full breadth of AFC's grant program this cycle with grants awarded to all five of our funding impact zones.

The grants awarded also represented wide-ranging parts of the country, literally, from coast to coast to coast, from Alert Bay, B.C. tolqualuit, N.U. to Gander, N. L. The 5 Impact Zones are Community Ministries, Leadership and Education, Diverse Infrastructure, Indigenous Ministries as well as Sacred Music and Liturgical Arts.

Our Dioceses "Say Yes To Kids" team was one of 33 teams across Canada. We raised the second most monies of all teams, \$7,381.00. Each of our three Camps in Algoma, Camp Gitchigomee, Camp Manitou and Camp Temiskaming received a cheque for just under \$2,000 for their bursary funds. The National Youth Initiative received the other portion.

Diocesan Social Justice Committee Connie Knighton, Representative from Muskoka



The focus of the Social Justice Committee continues to be homelessness.

After a successful weeklong, Diocesan-wide focus on homelessness in the spring, many parishes have taken up the call to be active in housing efforts in their communities.

St. Ambrose, Baysville, has been negotiating with the town of Baysville and the District of Muskoka to cede church lands in order to build co-operative, sustainable and supportive housing. This is not an easy process. Nevertheless, the roster of interested persons across the Deanery continues to grow and when we succeed, our small project may become a model for similar small projects on church lands across the Deanery. We have the full support of Archbishop Anne + and Diocesan Administration.

As you are aware, the problem of homelessness and housing insecurity and affordability is of concern to all of us who care about our sisters and brothers. Stay tuned for ways in which you might be able to help 'The Bridge,' our project is named.
