• City staff is in the process of entering back data and meetings will resume very soon.

Point In Time Count

• The PIT count was held January 26, 2023. There were 213 persons sheltered in emergency shelter and 11 persons in transitional housing for a total of 224 sheltered individuals experiencing homelessness. There were 48 households with 57 people in permanent supportive housing and 20 households with 30 people in rapid rehousing. The unsheltered count consisted of 16 people. The PIT/HIC data is due to HUD by April 28.

Coordinated Entry and HMIS Update

Home Base, a HUD Technical Assistance provider, is helping us with the Coordinated Entry Manual update.

Grant – Susan

• Nothing new to report. HUD hasn't announced the FY 2022 grant funding yet and the FY 23 grant application isn't open yet.

EFSP Ad Hoc Committee - Susan

• Woodbury County was awarded \$36,286 in Phase 40 fudning - \$726 for Admin awarded to Center For Siouxland and \$35,560 for direct services. Funding priorities for Phase 40 are: Rent/Mortgage, Utilities, Other Shelter, Other Food, Served Meals and Mass Shelter. The Local Board met March 1 and awarded \$33,060 to the Salvation Army for rent/mortgage and utilities assistance, and \$2,500 to FAVA for other food to provide canned goods and frozen food to veterans and their families. Once the Salvation Army has their UEI number, the Local Board plan will be submitted and funds should be available shortly after that. We will send out an email when the funds are available and agencies can refer clients to the Salvation Army for assistance.
