### Famous Face Reading Corner

Perhaps one of the most iconic faces in modern history is that of Princess Diana. What's interesting about reading famous faces is that we all sort of know a little bit about the person already—in this case we marginally know about Diana's troubled childhood and doomed marriage. But, face reading enables us to delve deeper into a person's outlook, personal choices, and even history. It allows us to fill in the blanks and confirm things about someone, and in the process perhaps even learn a little bit about ourselves. Today, we'll be looking at three separate features on Diana's face that really speak to who she was.



The first feature we'll examine is found on Diana's nose. She has what's referred to as a Low Septum, which is the fleshy divider between one's nostrils. What this seemingly trivial feature reveals is anything but small. People with Low Septums find the most fulfillment from work that they do in the service of others. And this couldn't ring more true for Diana, who was lovingly referred to as the People's Princess. Not one to shy away from controversial causes, Diana memorably shook an AIDS patient's hand in 1987, she walked amongst landmine fields in war-torn countries, and regularly advocated for the homeless. Her entire career was devoted to the service of others and she embraced this perhaps more fervently than any other royal had before. Her mission was to spread warmth and love to as many people as she could.

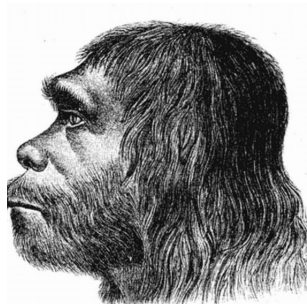
Even though Diana's public life and work was deeply fulfilling for her, her personal life—specifically her marriage—was perhaps the opposite for her, and this is clearly illustrated on her face. What's commonly referred to as “laugh lines”, face reading refers to as Disappointment Lines. They are the lines that run down from the sides of one's nose to the area beside the corners of the mouth. They reveal that one has experienced emotional disappointment and the deeper the line, the deeper the disappointment. If the line is on the right side, it indicates disappointment in work or public life, and if found on the left side of the face, it indicates disappointment in one's personal life. If we look at Diana's line on the left side of her face, we can plainly see how deeply it is etched. Many books and movies have been devoted to the greatly troubled marriage that Diana had with Prince Charles, and it came as no surprise to the public that the two divorced in 1996 after fifteen years of marriage. If you were to view pictures of Diana from before the marriage and at its dissolution, you can see just how much deeper that line on her left side had gotten. Interestingly, Chinese face reading refers to these same lines as Purpose Lines, and it is said that the wearer is living an authentic life and has found their true purpose. I believe the meaning of the lines is somewhere in the middle of the two approaches. One has to have met with disappointment in their lives in order to forge their own authenticity. And Diana certainly was a very different, more genuine woman at the end of her marriage than the naïve girl who entered into matrimony.

The final thing that we will look at on Diana is the rim of her left ear. I'm sure you've never devoted more than two seconds time to this seemingly inconsequential feature, but in Chinese face reading, it is said to reveal the history of one's childhood. If the rim thins out or has notches at particular places, it correlates to emotional or physical trauma sustained in specific years of one's youth. It is interesting to note that the left ear on a woman corresponds to the ages of 7-14. If we look at Diana's left ear rim, we can see that it sort of thins out, with slight notches, in the upper, outer portion. This area relates to ages 8-10 and that is precisely the timeframe that Diana was involved in a bitter

custody battle between her newly divorced parents. She later revealed as an adult that the most traumatizing period in her childhood was during that custody battle.

Even though we've only examined three features on Diana's face, we definitely have a better understanding of her history, her career motivations, and even her personal life. Imagine what could be revealed with a full face reading of her!

## Face Reading Insight

When I was first studying face reading and came across the meaning of a prominent brow ridge--that the wearer prefers known systems and procedures and believes that the accepted answer is the right answer--I was stumped. Usually with features, it's easy to understand their face reading definition. For

instance, it's obvious that a large mouth means that you are a big communicator. But, this brow ridge definition just didn't connect the dots for me. It wasn't until I recently began reading the phenomenal series by Jean M. Auel, *The Clan of the Cave Bear*, that I began to see the definition in action! In the series, Ms. Auel deftly describes how the clan (which was comprised of Neanderthals with prominent brow ridges) would act according to what has always been done. They would never even think to go against established tradition and its rules and regulations. Tradition had enabled them to survive through harrowing circumstances and a seemingly unforgiving natural order. Tradition was what they revered. When comparing their foreheads to their counterparts, the Cro-Magnons, you see that our more modern relatives didn't have that prominent brow ridge. What that meant for Cro-Magnons was that they saw no problem in attempting to leave tradition and shoot for innovation. This characteristic is what enabled Cro-Magnons to evolve and survive in the long-run, while Neanderthals couldn't adapt nearly as well. Once you study face reading, it brings such depth and value to everything you encounter--even a favorite book--and for this I am so grateful!
