Monday Morning Review

Electronic Permitting Bill Now 2015 Wisconsin Act 211

On March 1st, Governor Walker signed Senate Bill 458 (SB 458) into law. SB 458 was a WBA-supported bill, not only to make additions to the information that is required on the one- and two-family building permit, but also to phase in an electronic system that will allow municipalities to electronically submit one- and two-family building permit data to the Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS).

After being signed into law last week, SB 458 became 2015 Wisconsin Act 211. There is now a two year delayed effective date to allow DSPS time to build an electronic reporting system and for them to train local municipalities on how to use that system. This law will be fully implemented throughout Wisconsin by January 2, 2018.

Some of the highlights from 2015 Wisconsin Act 211 include:

- Making sure that all one- and two-family building permits contain the number and expiration date for any contractor that is pulling the building permit. A homeowner pulling a permit to work on the home they reside in is not required to have any DSPS credential to pull a permit.
- An extended time period for DSPS develop a system for individuals and municipalities to process one-and two-family building permits. DSPS has confirmed that they can fund this technological upgrade.
- An extended time period for municipalities to work with DSPS on the approval and submittal process of one- and two-family building permits through the administrative rule process.

- Flexibility for municipalities to get approval from DSPS on an electronic system for collecting and submitting one- and two-family building permits that they may already be using.
- Streamlining current law that requires municipalities to submit copies of all one- and two-family building permits to DSPS in 101.65(3).

The groups that worked hard on the compromise that was ultimately signed into law as 2015 Wisconsin Act 211 include the Wisconsin Towns Association, The Wisconsin League of Municipalities, the Wisconsin Code Officials Alliance, the Wisconsin Builders Association, and the DSPS.

The overall public policy goals contained in the act are the result of getting more input from the abovementioned groups to improve this legislation. The result of the changes contained in the substitute amendment eliminated opposition to the proposal from the groups mentioned above.

Thank you to those WBA members who provided input and guidance on this important piece of public policy that was originally contained in the WBA Advocacy Agenda for the 2015-2016 legislative session.

"NAHB Bringing Housing Home" Efforts with Speaker Paul Ryan

Recently, as part of the "NAHB Brining Housing Home" efforts, a number of members were able to meet with Speaker Paul Ryan in his district office in Janesville to discuss important housing issues. This is the first formal meeting that has been set up between Wisconsin members and Speaker Ryan since he became the Speaker of the House last year.

JP Delmore, who currently serves as a NAHB Assistant Vice President with tax policy as his leader area of expertise, came in from Washington D.C. to attend the meeting as well. We thank Executive Director Kris Hillmer with the Metropolitan Builders Association for taking the lead in requesting this meeting, and to South Central Wisconsin BA Executive Officer Carol Engebretson for working to get members to attend this important sit-down with Speaker Ryan.

Some of the topics covered during the meeting included how housing fit into the Speaker's poverty agenda and how the tax code can be simplified while still protecting homeowners and renters to foster more economic growth and upward mobility. Another big topic that was discussed was the issue of reforming the area of housing financing.

Speaker Ryan stated that members of his caucus are currently working on a number of important policy items to address many of the issues raised during the meeting on Thursday.

One of the key takeaways from the meeting was the statement that, in order to help housing in our country,

the best thing that could be done would be to "get government out of housing."

Marquette Law School Poll: Feingold Still Up; Walker Still in High 30%,

In late February the Marquette University Law School Poll issued its latest installment of polling data for Wisconsin. The Poll, conducted by Professor Charles Franklin, has become the gold standard for polling data as it has been found to be highly accurate when compared to past final election data in Wisconsin.

In what will likely be one of the most watched races for U.S. Senate in the entire country, U.S. Senator Russ Feingold is still maintaining a double digit lead against current U.S. Senator Ron Johnson, 49% to 37%. It was noted that this number has changed little since November 2015. Certainly, when you are an incumbent in the year of an election and are down 12%, it is far from where you want to be as you head into a fall reelection bid. Because of this, we can likely expect to see more advertising this spring and possibly summer, in an attempt to bring up Johnson's numbers to stop Feingold's momentum from continuing through the summer months.

In addition, The Marquette Law School Poll asked once again about pollsters' opinions on Governor Walker. The poll contacted 802 registered voters between February 18 and 21, and had a margin of error of 4.5%. Governor Walker's approval rating in February 2016 remains relatively unchanged from January 2016. The most recent approval rating for the governor comes in at 39%, standing at 38% last month. Governor Walker has been aggressively traveling the state and taking on a number of public policy initiatives, most notably a package of changes to address college student debt, in an effort to reconnect with Wisconsin voters and improve his approval rating.

Finally, in a statewide race that voters will decide on April 5, the Marquette University Law School Poll shows a dead heat between Justice Rebecca Bradley and challenger Judge JoAnne Kloppenburg 37% to 36% by voters who said they were "absolutely certain" they would be voting in the April 5 election. This polling number tracks the results of the primary election early this month that had Bradley winning narrowly 45% to 43%, with a third candidate, Judge Joe Donald, receiving 12% of the vote. Donald recently endorsed Kloppenburg, and it will be interesting to see if that gives her a bump in future polling, considering the endorsement was done after the poll was conducted. Election watchers from all sides predict the race for Wisconsin Supreme Court in April to be very close.

Grvboski Recently Named Advocacy Vice Chair

With the installation of the new WBA Board of Directors and leadership on January 29, we also welcome new leaders to the WBA Advocacy Group. Mike Howe recently moved from his positon of Advocacy Group Vice Chair to Chair, replacing Jim Doering. WBA President-elect David Belman also indicated that Steve Gryboski of Gryboski Builders has accepted his appointment to become the WBA Advocacy

Vice Chair for 2016. When David Belman is installed as the WBA President in early 2017, Gryboski will move up to become the Chair of the WBA Advocacy Group, becoming a member of the WBA Executive Committee as well.

Steve, along with his brother Bob, currently operate Gryboski Builders in Green Bay. Their parents, Roger and Cathy, were great mentors and have been enjoying retirement since 1996. Before Roger and Cathy, their grandfather, Ted, and great grandfather, Joseph, were also builders.

We are looking forward to working with Steve as the Vice Chair of the Advocacy Group in 2016 as we begin work on the elections for State Assembly and State Senate this fall and start to establish our 2017-2018 WBA Advocacy Agenda.

Legislative Housing Committee Members Announce Retirements

Recently, a longtime member of the Assembly Housing and Real Estate Committee (and former chair) John Murtha and a new member of the Senate Committee on Insurance and Housing Committee, Nikiya Harris Dodd, announced that they would not be seeking reelection this fall.

State Senator Nikiya Harris Dodd, a democrat from Milwaukee who was serving her first term as a member of the Senate Committee on Insurance and Real Estate, announced that she would not be seeking a second term as a member of the state senate.

In a statement announcing she would not seek reelection, Harris Dodd said, "I am honored to have earned the trust and respect of my constituents to serve as their voice in the fight for justice, fairness, and equity for the people in our great state. As the eldest of thirteen siblings, I have never shied away from making difficult decisions or taking on tough challenges. My decision to not seek reelection is at the top of the list of many difficult decisions I have made. My love, passion, and commitment to improve conditions for citizens of Milwaukee will continue to be my driving force."

This week also came the official announcement that State Representative John Murtha, a republican from Baldwin, would not seek reelection this fall. Murtha has served as a member of the state assembly from the 29th Assembly District since his election to an open seat in 2006.

Murtha released a statement on his decision, saying, "The legislature has accomplished a lot during my tenure, and I am proud of the work we have done. When Republicans gained control of both houses in 2011, Wisconsin's unemployment rate was at 8 percent. By holding the line on taxes, reforming our administrative codes, and sticking to conservative principles, we created an environment for small businesses to grow. Today, the unemployment rate is at 4.4 percent. Just recently, we had our best one-month private sector job growth since 1992. Our economy has gotten better and I believe it will continue to get better."

Murtha formerly served as the chair of the Assembly Housing and Real Estate Committee before moving into a spot on the Assembly GOP leadership team. This session Murtha served as a member of the committee he once chaired.

Both Harris Dodd and Murtha were great to work with as members of committees that we interact with a great deal, and they will be missed next session. For their efforts in support of housing, both Harris Dodd and Murtha were recently awarded WBA "Friend of Housing" awards for 2016.

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Take your mobile emails up a notch

Sending texts and emails from your phone is a part of life and business, but maintaining your professionalism doesn't have to go out the window when you're on the go. Consider these quick tips from Cellcom to master mobile messaging:

- Edit your email signature The default signature in the stock mail apps typically only indicates the message has been sent from a mobile device, but doesn't include your name or contact information. You can edit the signature in your settings menu. For iOS go to Settings>Mail, Contacts, Calendar and scroll down to signature. For Android, it can vary depending on your device, but if you go into your mail app, tap the menu button and then settings, you'll see your signature simply tap to edit.
- Create keyboard shortcuts if you find yourself typing the same word (like your company name) or phrase on your mobile device, create shortcuts to save you time when crafting your messages. On iOS, visit Settings>General>Keyboard>Shortcuts and tap on the plus sign in the top right corner. You'll see blanks for phrase and shortcuts. the letter combination you want to expand to your phrase. For Android, visit Settings>Language & Keyboard>Input>Personal dictionary. You'll again tap the plus sign to add your phrase **and** shortcut options.

• Avoid emojis and emoticons – Ever wonder why the letter "J" shows up in emails on your phone? Or why there's a box with a question mark inside on your desktop email client? Emojis that are commonplace in texting and messaging don't always translate to desktop email. Conversely, emoticons, created using combinations of symbols on your desktop computer, don't show up as intended on mobile devices. With emails being cross-platform in many business situations, it's best to leave these icons out if you don't know where the recipient will be reading the message.
