



A WORD FROM PASTOR KATHERINE

Today, there seems to be an increasing number of people who seem averse to any kind of moral discernment that might prove personally limiting, while simultaneously experiencing a crisis of purpose, loss of direction in life, and feeling vulnerable and powerless. How can this be?

Some years ago, already, a colleague and friend, Rev. Al Sandness, shared about a school in New York where a TIP (*Technology Immersion Pilot*) program is working to address the plight of many inner-city youth for whom the "right to an education" is more myth than fact. He described a four-story school where the first three floors housed "regular" school and the fourth housed a TIP school. As an observer walked through the first three floors of the facility, there was little, if there were any, formal education happening. Noise, graffiti, and mayhem, however, were plentiful! In stark contrast, the fourth floor of the school held classrooms filled with students who had signed a contract and statement of purpose in order that they might attend. Here students were attentively listening to teachers, following along in their books, generally showing respect toward self and others. What made the difference? How can two such opposite realities exist side-by-side? Sadly, there are several more examples we can lift up:

- Violence springing from beliefs that espouse a Christian ethic of peace while assassinating Public Servants who hold a differing view etc..
- The ever-growing disparity between the rich and poor.
- Advancements in medicine and technology outpacing legal or ethical jurisdiction.
- The beauty of creation and the alarming increase in extremes of weather and natural disasters.

It occurs to me how this dual reality reveals the paradox of prayer and prophecy. A great deal of research has been accumulated over the past several decades that bears out the ancient and scriptural truth that prayer and human thought hold the potential to shape future events and change seemingly inevitable outcomes. In fact, the prophets of the Old Testament always declared a message of impending doom, destruction, and desolation accompanied by a simultaneous vision of peace and paradise.

For centuries, prophets and sages have suggested that one-tenth of one percent of humanity, working together in a unified effort, may shift the consciousness of the entire world. If those numbers are accurate, then surprisingly few individuals can plant the seeds of great possibilities. At present the population of the world is estimated to be approximately 8.2 billion people. One percent of our global neighborhood, then, is represented by 80 million people, with one tenth of that number being 8 million people. That's roughly the population of New York City!

Although these statistics may represent an OPTIMUM number to bring about change, studies in Jerusalem and other large population centers suggest that the numbers to initiate such change may be even smaller. Documented studies indicate that the first effects of mass meditation/prayer became noticeable when the number of people participating in the effort was greater than the square root of one

percent of the population. A city of one million people, for example, this value represents **only one hundred individuals!**

Think about that! In a community of 2000 people, 1% of twenty like-minded people united in a common effort can usher a new reality into existence, see Matthew 18:19-20! Science has undertaken to prove what Christians have long known, our thoughts and prayers are concrete, measurable, and directive forces in creation! You might ask whether such a small percentage of the population is "enough" to influence change in the world. The answer of faith is a resounding, YES!! Jesus started a world/life transforming reality with an inner circle of 12!

May the Holy Spirit of God guide our thoughts and empower our communal prayers so that the world *God* imagines becomes a reality!
