FAITH LUTHERAN CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES January 29, 2023

The annual Meeting was called to order by Council President Dean Lindquist. Opening prayer was given by Pastor Katherine Rood Tracy Tebben agreed to act as Parliamentarian.

Doug Gronli moved and Nathan Grotelueschen seconded the motion to adopt the agenda as provided. Motion passed. Ron Peterson moved and Guy Christianson seconded the motion to approve the minutes from the 2022 Annual Meeting. Motion passed.

Sonya Erickson, Council Treasurer, presented the Financial Summary of 2022. She answered a few questions that were asked at the Mission Plan Presentation, concerning the mortgage interest rate and recap of the church's income. Sue Rime moved to accept the 2022 Financial Summary and Nona Oie seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Sonya also presented the 2023 Mission Plan. She explained how the Mission Plan committee came up with the increased budget. Using the Mission Site Profile, the committee looked at areas in our church the members had asked to focus on: **visitation**, **worship and education**. The Mission Plan committee used 2019 (pre-COVID) as a comparison.

New Business:

Election for Council members: The Church Council recommended three new members to take the place of the three exiting Council members. The recommended members are: Dean Lindquist for second term, Mary Felt and Mike Buboltz. Tim Renner moved that Faith Church accepts the nominations for the three new Council members and Doug Gronli seconded that motion. Motion passed.

Election of new members for the Endowment Committee: The Nominations Committee seeks Faith Church members approval for Jennifer Davenport and Landon Fries (second term) to be Endowment Committee members. Doug Gronli moved to nominate Jennifer Davenport and Landon Fries to be members of the Endowment Committee and Lynn Dwyer seconded that motion. Motion passed.

Quorum Requirements: The Congregational Council proposes a motion to change the Congregational Meeting requirements as set in C10.04 of the Constitution, from 7% of voting membership to 50 members voting and present. Tracy Tebben seconded this motion. Motion passed.

Approval of 2023 Mission Plan: LuAnn Rudningen moved to accept the 2023 Mission Plan, and Carter Stenberg seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Staff and Ministry Reports:

Dean Lindquist made the members aware that the Simply Giving software has made it difficult to change the monetary giving amount and wanted members to ask for assistance from the Faith Church Office Administrator, Tina Magner to make the changes.

As we enter 2024, we are thankful for the successful completion of various projects, such as the purchase of a garden tractor with a sweeper attachment, which has been instrumental in keeping our premises/sidewalks free of snow. YOUTH MINISTRY REPORT

Psalm 27:13 says, "I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living." As I reflect on the past year, I give thanks for all the goodness I've seen, been a part of, and been shown. My growing family and I are incredibly blessed to be a part of these faith communities. I'm really privileged to be able to share my time with both Peace and Faith Lutheran churches. I continue to share my time equally as one can with both churches, focusing on youth events, planning and coordinating summer trips, supporting our Confirmation programming, and coordinating our shared youth group, LYF.

Our Youth Events in 2023 had a lot of variety in fun and learning, that helped our students see how God is working in their lives in a variety of ways. Our most successful events in my opinion were the 6-12 grade ski trip in February and 5th Quarter for grades 6-8 after selected home varsity football games this past fall. On Homecoming night alone, we had 63 students at Peace Lutheran playing games and having fun. Those 63 kids represented Faith & Peace Lutheran, as well as three other area churches. It was an amazing community outreach event, and I'm grateful for the parent volunteers who made it possible! I look forward to doing this in the coming year, as well as adding "3rd Half", after two basketball games this winter.

LYF (pronounced "life") stands for Live Your Faith and is our shared High School Youth Group. We met regularly on Wednesday nights throughout the year and had special events like our Christmas Party, BUNCO Night at Faith, and others, We ended the school year with a lock-in at Peace that was based on the reality show "Survivor". Throughout the year, we rotated our meeting spot between the two churches. In the school year, we played games and shared devotions. In the summer, we often played yard games and had cookouts together. This year we regularly had about ten students, with a good mix from each church. They are an incredible group of gifted young adults and it's an honor to grow with them in faith each week.

Our big trip this past summer was a canoe trip on the Crow Wing River. I had three brave souls join me for a fun week of growing in faith together. We started in Menahga, MN and ended just north of Staples, MN for a total of two half days and two full days of canoeing 33 river miles. Together we canoed, sang songs around the campfire, and devotions, and studied scripture. It was an amazing week of new experiences and food for those boys. In 2024, I'm hoping to repeat that trip. It's a ministry I wholeheartedly believe in. In the summer of 2024, we're also hoping to offer two service and learning trips. The first is for our middle school students in grades 6-8 to Racine, Wi with Serve Boldly. Our second trip is for our high school students to the ELCA Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July 2024.

Each and every day I give thanks for the opportunity to serve in this ministry. I continue finding joy in all of the youth and families that I get the privilege to walk alongside with. I'm thankful for the many parents and families that volunteer their time and talents for events and special activities. Without volunteers, our ministry together wouldn't be possible. Thank you for a great year, I'm really excited for all that 2024 has to offer!

Seeds & Sprouts is a ministry program that happens on Wednesday nights for kids ages Preschool through 5th grade.

The night starts with some group get-to-know you questions and discussing the plan for the night. Then the kids split into 2 groups of various ages and do a craft/art project based on the night's biblical theme. Then we all come back together to do a Bible lesson and discussion. We end the night with time playing a large group game or activity.

Faith's children's ministry continues to be a great asset to our church. At the start of last year, the children's ministry was led by a paid coordinator. It is now a mostly volunteer collaborative effort. Tina Magner added an additional 4 paid hours to her schedule to take charge of curriculum writing, sharing her expertise in creating engaging and enriching materials for our young people. She has done an amazing job! Welcome Center volunteers gather materials for the lessons each week. The combination of our exceptional team of dedicated volunteers & the Education Committee has proven to be a great fit for our church. It's wonderful to see how our church continues to prioritize our children's spiritual growth and well-being.

Sunday school includes children who are 3 years old to 5th grade. Each Sunday kids meet in the multipurpose room for a short worship and then go to classrooms for a bible lesson and activity. We currently have 70 children enrolled, an increase from last year. Sunday school funds go towards snacks, craft supplies, service projects that give back to the community and lesson materials.

- Put together Sugar Cookie Kits for the Link & Care Kits for Glen Oaks
- Decorated place mats for Tuesday's Table and gifts for members of Faith and people in our community

FAITH VISITORS REPORT Anna Haats

In May, we met with Pastor Tim and began reorganizing this ministry. Our group served 22 people this past year! We did this through visits, phone calls, cards and gifts. The connections formed from these visits were positive and impactful for both the visitors and the people being visited.

WELCA REPORT

The Faith WELCA has downsized to only the 3 mission divisions: The Rachel Circle Bible Study, the School Book Backpack Program and Faith Quilters.

Rachel Circle Bible Study

We met 10 times during 2022 at various members' homes or church. We had an average of 6 members at each meeting. We use the Gather magazine, published by the Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, for our bible studies.

We take an offering at each meeting. During 2023 Rachel Circle made donations to Green Lake Bible Camp Scholarship, Food drive, Family Promise, Freezer meals and Faith Quilters.

School Book Backpack Program

We do this program each fall, and this year it was headed by Lynda Manselle. She collected and sent off 98 backpacks to Lutheran World Relief in August. Brian Geiseke delivered to the cities.

Faith Quilters

The Faith Quilters meet on the 2nd and 4th Monday and Tuesdays of each month except for the months of June, July, August, and December from 9:00am to 3:00 pm. With this as a mission program we function on monetary donations from the congregation, members' Thrivent donations, and individual donations of material, yarn, thread, etc. This is a volunteer program, and everyone comes and goes as time permits them. This year we met 26 times and a total of 230 people making our daily total approximately 9 people each day.

The total quilts made were 140 including: 21 quilts donated to the Faith High School Seniors, 4 theme quilts for the new rooms at the Family Promise housing in Willmar, and others sent to Green Lake Bible Camp, Salvation Army, Red Cross, Hospice, Safe Avenues, Woodlands Center, and Lutheran World Relief.

Our quilting day uses people to cut and sew material squares together, pin tops with bottoms, tie the tops and bottoms, and those to sew around the quilt for the finished pieces. Something for all talents or interests, and we welcome all to join us!

COLUMBARIUM REPORT

It has now been 8 years since you, the members of Faith Lutheran Church, authorized the construction and implementation of Phase I of the Columbarium. Through careful budgeting and utilization of volunteers we were able to not only complete the first niche unit set up but also saved enough to complete the altar area along with the tiered seating area and prayer gardens. Together they have provided not only an area of solitude and contemplation but also an area that knows the joy of baptisms and the music heard at regular outdoor worship services. During the time of COVID it provided the opportunity for group worship in an outdoor setting allowing us to be together even if we could not be inside.

We currently have sold 47 of the 96 niches with many having also paid their after passing costs as well. These after death funds are maintained to pay for the engraving and the urns at the time of passing. As we move forward we will plan for continuance of Phase II which will incorporate additional sidewalks to the north and bases for the further niche units. The units themselves will be installed as we see needs arise based upon sales of existing niches. Due to the increased cost of the niche units themselves the individual niches will be marketed for a cost that will be higher than what the existing units are selling for which is \$1600. If you or others in the community that you know are considering purchasing a niche this would be a good time to do so.

As we reported last year Ian Carlson, Son of Don and Kristi Carlson, completed his Eagle Scout Project which included installation of limestone benches along with new plantings and rubber mulch. I think that you will agree that this update to the landscaping has added a lot to the area. Thanks again to Ian and his team for this excellent accomplishment.

Speaking of maintenance, we also wish to recognize and thank Tim Renner and his crew of lawn mowers and snow shovelers for keeping the entire Prayer Garden area looking neat and trim. There are always a lot of behind the scenes activities that must be undertaken to keep the area looking neat and inviting.

Please also feel free to remind others in our community that this place of rest is open to all believers. One does not need to be a member of Faith Lutheran to be inurned at Faith. The cost of a niche in this unit remains at \$1600 which, together with the after-death costs (\$325 for each person) allows for the inurnment of 2 individuals. Simply contact the church office for assistance in setting up an appointment.

MISSION REPORT Mission Committee

The Mission Committee assists Faith members in becoming involved in mission opportunities here at Faith and by following Christ to serve our neighbors beyond our doors, in the community, county, and world. A big THANK YOU to everyone who has supported their neighbors through missions this year!

With our member's generous gifts of time, work, and resources, Faith has supported the following organizations with our VOLUNTEER HOURS, MISSION OF THE MONTH OFFERINGS and NOISY OFFERINGS:

- <u>Safe Avenues</u> Provides advocacy, parenting time services, and emergency shelter for victims of domestic and sexual violence in a five (5) county area of West Central MN.
- <u>The Link</u> A partnership of Spicer and New London area congregations, providing programs to residents experiencing financial struggles. Our offering collections supported:
- <u>Food Pantry</u> Providing groceries for families with food needs.
- <u>Wildcat Backpack food program</u> Providing weekend food for NLS student families with food needs.
- <u>Tuesday's Table</u> A community meal for all on a weekly rotation of five (5) congregations. Meal is hosted at Faith by our volunteers on the 3rd Tuesday of the Month.
- Christmas Joy (Faith's Mitten Tree) Providing Christmas gifts for families in need.
- <u>Thrift Store</u> This year, our Mission Committee has been recruiting volunteers to be Thrift Store workers at The Link on selected Saturdays.
- Family Promise of Kandiyohi County An interfaith ministry consisting of approximately twenty (20) county congregations serving families who are experiencing homelessness. FPKC opened a residential shelter in 2023. This past summer, volunteers from Faith helped fund and prepare one bedroom at the new shelter. In addition to shelter, FPKC provides advocacy services to families seeking affordable housing. Faith coordinates providing meals for FPKC guests four (4) weeks a year, with volunteers from Faith, Peace, and Universal Unitarian working together to provide meals and groceries on our scheduled weeks to Family Promise guests at their shelter in Willmar.
- <u>Community Garden</u> Fenced-in garden plots, on Faith's property, are available at a very affordable cost to anyone wishing to garden. Watering is included. A "Bounty Cart" offers excess vegetables to anyone.

- Green Lake Lutheran Ministries A partnership of camps, communities, and congregations supporting Green Lake Bible Camp, Shores of St Andrew Bible Camp, and Camp House. These camps of the ELCA provide a wide variety of opportunities to campers and retreat participants of all ages. Faith is also blessed to provide summer worship services at Green Lake.
- <u>Vacation Bible School</u> Offering a fun-filled Christian education experience to our youth. Partnering with Peace Lutheran Church and Green Lake Bible Camp.
- Red Cross Offering services in Central Minnesota for disaster relief and coordinating blood drives.
- <u>Freezer Meals</u> Here at Faith. Participants in the Freezer Meal Ministry pay for the groceries to make meals for their own families as well as cover the costs for additional meals that are frozen and stored at the church and later delivered to those who are grieving, experiencing illness, welcoming a baby or just in need of a meal. They get together in the afternoon and spend time together prepping, preparing, and dividing all the food so it is ready to be taken home for a quick and easy meal down the road.
- Quilters Making and providing warm quilts to Lutheran World Relief, Red Cross, Salvation Army, Faith's high school graduates, and various organizations in need. This year, quilts were provided for a bedroom at the Family Promise Residential Shelter. Traditionally, a quilt is also donated to the GLLM Auction.
- Faith's annual plantings outside the church were also boosted by Noisy Offering.

<u>Investment Summary:</u>

The General Endowment balance on 12/31/22 was \$172,644.17 and the balance of the Education Endowment was \$43,537.95.

The General Endowment balance on 12/31/23 was \$187,743.46 and the balance of the Education Endowment was \$46,409.86.

The 2023 Rate of Return of the endowment funds was 8.75% for the General Endowment and 6.60% for the Education Endowment.

Granting Summary:

Total granted dollars in 2023 was \$1,399.98.

The granting included \$399.98 to the education and Sunday School for new games, \$500 for the youth and \$500 for seasonal decor.

Operations Report:

The 2023 calendar year proved to be a year where we were able to focus on utilizing the granting process, and policies put into place in the years prior. The policies being up to date, and the investments assigned accordingly, we were able to focus on our granting process. Our committee met 4 times in 2023, February 21, March 14, May 30 and November 14. For 2024 it is our intent to focus on increased awareness of the endowment fund, education for estate planning and inclusion in legacy giving, and to increase participation in the granting of funds.

THE CIRCLE OF SUPPORT REPORT

Circle of Support Team

Mission Statement: To extend the love of Christ through a visitation ministry that seeks to grow and support relationships. Our focus group are those experiencing grief and loss.

Circle of Support is a group of twenty Faith members who reach out to people who are experiencing grief and loss. This past year we have supported over 30 families through visits, card ministry and other contacts. We continue to ask for help in identifying people in our congregation who are going through grief or loss.

Highlights

- A spreadsheet was developed to track people visited through Circle of support to help pastors follow the needs for visitation or support. Members update the pastors on their activity which is added to the spreadsheet.
- We received a monetary donation which was used to purchase the series of 4 Stephen Ministry grief booklets to share with people throughout the first year of their grief journey.
- A "resource library' was developed in the Welcome Center to help Circle of Support members.
- Prayer shawls/squares were made available to visitors.
- Evy Hatjistilianos presented a workshop for the Circle of Support and Visitation groups on September 18th on Loneliness, Listening & Love.
- A card ministry was developed in September with Tina's help. Cards are sent to Faith members who have had the death of a loved one. A note card is included with resource information and phone numbers of the pastors for their use.
- A four-week Grief Support Group was held on October 16-November 6 with Brenda Weise leading it. Nine people signed up for it.
- A Blue Christmas service was held at First Lutheran of Norway Lake together with Peace Lutheran on December 21st.
- A gift of money enabled the group and the visitation group to share Amaryllis bulbs with people we have been following.

For 2024, we are hoping to offer an adult education class on death/funeral planning, add a link on the church website for grief resources, meet quarterly to connect, and offer another grief support group in the spring.

THE LUTEFISK OPENER REPORT

The tradition continues. I reckon that you think that I am speaking of eating Lutefisk. However, the tradition of whence I speak is not simply enjoying Lutefisk but more importantly is the tradition of joyfully serving others. This does not happen without the whole church family's support.

This tradition encompasses not only serving 500 people a great sit-down meal, but also the act of visiting with the larger community and demonstrating by action that we truly are a community that works well together. This attitude of service extends to times spent in disaster recovery and caroling at Christmas as well as Tuesday's Table, volunteering at the Link and Family Promise. Serving others graciously is not a gift but rather something we learn by doing.

This year our large cadre of Lutefisk Team members and donors served 500 people. Many of these team members had never worked together to prepare for and serve this large sized group yet the entire meal went off with very few hiccups. We had people learn to bake bread together, to organize the various teams and to support each other. Everyone worked well together and experienced the fun and camaraderie of being part of a team. So here are the particulars.

Together we served 500 meals of lutefisk and meatballs. That is a great number for the first sit down gathering since 2019. After expenses we netted about \$3800. We heard nothing but high compliments about the quality of the meal, the desserts and the fine job done by everyone. Diners were especially impressed with all the youth that helped and how well everyone worked together with a smile. They also appreciated that even while working they made time to stop and visit with the diners.

Overall, a very successful return to the Lutefisk supper. It accomplished the goals of bringing people into our church and provided an opportunity for us to serve them. It also provided an opportunity for the diners to renew old acquaintances and make new friends.

BETHESDA MEMBER CONGREGATION REPORT

Chery Johnson

Jeff and I attended Bethesda's annual meeting on October 19, 2023, as representatives from Faith. Bethesda is a locally led and managed nonprofit that provides housing and care for seniors including skilled nursing care, short-stay therapy, home health care, outpatient therapy, independent and assisted living, adult day services, and a wellness center. They have 3 campuses, one in Willmar, North Point in New London, and an assisted living site in Olivia. There are 23 member congregations of various denominations who help to support the mission of Bethesda. Representatives from the member churches are invited to attend the annual meeting to learn about the mission and accomplishments of the organization over the past year.

Some of the highlights from 2023 included:

- The organization has a 37.2-million-dollar budget. Of that, \$17.2 million is invested into payroll for its approximately 500 employees.
- \$0.93 of every dollar generated goes back into resident care, programs and services provided.
- Just over \$100,000 was invested back into staff tuition, student scholarships and education to maintain quality care for its residents and ensure that staff are afforded opportunities to grow within the Bethesda family.
- 2,018 individuals were served in 2023 through Bethesda's entities and services.

Other services provided through Bethesda include Parkinson's Support Groups, Alzheimer's Support Groups, Befriender's Ministry Training, Parkinson's Wellness Recovery Training

Current Building Projects include:

- 10 additional independent living units and a heated saltwater pool on the North Point Campus in New London with completion in fall of 2024.
- Completion of final updates at the Willmar Campus skilled nursing facility including community dining/gathering areas and additional living suite units.
- Planning a spring groundbreaking for an approximately 125-unit independent living housing project on Willmar Avenue.

The annual meeting provided an excellent opportunity to learn more about the work of Bethesda in our community and to realize the many opportunities for all in our communities to participate in supporting the elderly and disabled who receive services through Bethesda by volunteering time, talents and through financial support in conjunction with the Bethesda Foundation.

Chery is also honored to serve on Bethesda's Board of Directors.

GLLM MEMBER CONGREGATION REPORT

Green Lake Lutheran Ministries

Dear Congregational Partners,

What was true over 85 years ago when Green Lake Lutheran Ministries (GLLM) was founded, still holds true today — God shows up in life-changing ways within our ministries!

The facts of 2023:

- Summer program numbers increased by 314 participants!
- Retreat and conference numbers increased drastically!
- Event participation exploded in 2023 making things like our Dinner Theater, Quilt Auction, and community worships a sizable and significant joy in our program year!
- The total number of donors, number of individual gifts, and total dollar amount received all hit all-time highs!

And along with all this excitement, we have even more to look forward to! Work has begun on The Village at Shores of St. Andrew Bible Camp. This over \$1 million dollar project as part of the Water's Edge Campaign will create a wildly vibrant space for the life-changing love of Jesus to be shared. We can't wait to reintroduce this already cherished space to the GLLM network.

Overall income is projected to increase by \$300,000 over 2022 but expenses have also increased as well. We underestimated the expense of the wild growth we experienced this year and going into the last weeks of the year, have a significant deficit to overcome. Thank you to our many partners who are supporting our efforts to finish the year strong.

Together, we have accomplished so much! Thank you for supporting GLLM through your participation, your volunteerism, your gifts, and your mission support. I relish the relationship we have created that goes far past a simple "transaction" and truly deserves the designation of "partnership."

The format of this report doesn't allow near the space needed to process the entire year nor thank all that contributed to its success. Please be on the lookout for our annual report which will be made available in the later half of January 2024.
