

Happy New Year!

No, I am not getting ahead of myself, at least not in the church world. December (actually November 29th) brings us the start of a new church calendar year. We have left the Gospel of Matthew and are now entering the Gospel of Mark. Each new year we start at the beginning, in the season of Advent and the preparation of the arrival of the Messiah.

The Gospel of Mark is the shortest of the four, as though the author had this sense of great urgency to spit out the story of Jesus as quickly as possible. And given all that has taken place over the past several months, many of us may be feeling this way about the year 2020: let's get it over with already! We may even be wanting to wish everyone a Happy New Year early in hopes that 2021 will give us all a fresh start, where we can put the past behind us and never look back. Hey 2020, don't let the door hit you on the way out!

Here's the thing. The year that Jesus was born wasn't exactly a great year. The census had thrown a huge wrench into everyone's normal schedules. Where people would normally be working and making an income to support their families, they now found themselves making lengthy and expensive travel plans to be registered in their hometowns. A cruel tyrant was the king of Judea, a man so consumed by power, he ordered the deaths of babies just to ensure that he kept his throne.

Into that world, God arrived, and in our world God remains: through good years, bad years, crazy years, and years that we never thought we'd be living through, years that make us want to hurry through to the next one and a fresh start. Emmanuel means "God with us." That's it. Not "God with us when things are good" or "God with us when things are normal." Just "God with us." The Gospel of Mark may be the briefest Gospel, but it still tells the full story of Jesus, and it doesn't leave out the bad years. 2020 is certainly a year that will be remembered for the rest of our lives, but just like every year, it is a year that includes the season of Advent, and the promise and hope and anticipation of the arrival of Jesus. Emmanuel. God with us.


#### CHRISTMAS WORSHIP UPDATE

Due to ever-changing circumstances surrounding the Covid 19 Pandemic, Faith is currently evaluating the most meaningful and safe way for us to celebrate Christmas. #### What is Advent?

The Advent season is a four week period before Christmas that celebrates the anticipation and coming of Jesus Christ, the Messiah. The origin of "advent" is from the Latin word *adventus* which simply translates "coming" or "arrival". Not only is the Christian meaning for preparation and celebration of the coming of Jesus Christ, his birth at Christmas, but also to celebrate the new life when someone accepts Jesus Christ as their Savior, and lastly, the anticipation of Jesus returning again.

There are many beautiful and rich traditions behind the celebration of Advent. Our hope is that you find time to slow down this Christmas season, say "no" to the things that distract you from Jesus and say "yes" to the gift that God wants you to experience.





#### Simple Things to Pray For During Advent:

- 1. Pray for attentiveness to what truly matters, without being distracted by trivial things.
- 2. Pray for opportunities to learn something new regularly.
- 3. Pray for discernment of how God would like you to set your priorities and the ability to focus on them consistently to fulfill His purposes in your life.
- 4. Pray for the grace to be able to rest, become aware of God's presence, and enjoy it.
- 5. Pray for strong relationships with other people in the bond of a loving community.
- 6. Pray for peace in all situations, no matter what the circumstances.
- 7. Pray for an enlivened imagination that helps you contribute to the world in creative ways.
- 8. Pray for freedom from all that burdens you past mistakes, fears, destructive habits, hurts other people have inflicted, and more.
- 9. Pray for joy and a sense of humor.
- 10. Pray for confidence in God's love for you and trust in His power to work things out for the best in your life.
- 11. Pray for a clear mind and the ability to clearly communicate what you value to others.
- 12. Pray for purity so you can grow as a person and encounter God more fully.
- 13. Pray for openness to the Holy Spirit's guidance.
- 14. Pray for a genuine awareness of God's grace in your life and the humility to extend grace to others.

October's Income looks unbelievable thanks to a generous estate gift received last month. Faith Lutheran has a gift acceptance policy for large gifts like this which directs the council to designate a minimum of 10% for congregational benevolences, a minimum of 40% of the gift as an addition to the congregation's endowment fund. No more than 50% will be used for the current operating expenses of the congregation. Use of those funds will be determined at a later time. Sixty percent of the gift is included in October's Income. The far right column shows a clear picture of what the financials would be without that unique gift. As you can see what a blessing an estate gift can be to your congregation. If you are interested in learning about ways you may include Faith Lutheran in your estate plans feel free to speak to Pastor Todd or Pastor Seyward. We are fortunate to have the resources in our backyard, of Pastor Keith Pearson an ELCA Gift Planner.

### **Legacy Gift Received**

Faith has been the recipient of a Legacy Gift of \$170,000.00 from Al and Elaine Iverson. The Iverson's established an IRA for Faith Lutheran, and this faithful and fruitful manner of giving will leave a lasting legacy here at Faith. In accordance with the Faith Lutheran Major Gifts Policy, 10 % of the gift has been passed on to ministries beyond our walls. 40% of the gift will be deposited in the Faith general Endowment Fund, and the remaining proceeds of the gift will be available to further our ministry in the congregation and community. We give thanks to God for the lasting legacy Al and Elaine Iverson will leave in our congregation.

## **Council Updates**

Our congregation recently received a large gift of over \$170,000 from the Iverson family. The council voted to split the benevolence portion of the Iverson gift equally between Green Lake Lutheran Ministries, The Link, and Family Promise.

The budget committee continues to work on a 2021 mission plan in a difficult time of uncertainty.

The COVID Worship Task Force (formerly known as the Re-entering Worship Task Force) will continue meeting regularly to plan next steps in worship that meet our needs as a congregation while also ensuring our safety and following guidelines set by local and state health professionals. Thank you to Dave Eliason, Steve Gerberding, Chery Johnson, Louise Stenberg, Jody Wharton, Pastor Seyward, and Pastor Todd.

As most of us ride out the pandemic in our homes, the guests of Family Promise have been living in the Day Center rather than sleeping at churches. When you're feeling in a slump because of the disruptions in your usual activities, please be thankful that you have a home to sleep in, and prayerfully consider how you can help. Homeless numbers have been increasing during the

pandemic, and the space at the Day Center is very limited. Our Family Promise Director has been busy coordinating with other area agencies to help families avoid becoming homeless during this pandemic.

We also want to extend a big THANK YOU to everyone who donated feminine hygiene products during the month of October. This collection was very successful!





In October, **The Food Pantry** welcomed 3 new families, served 56 children, 83 adults and 19 seniors. 3695 pounds of food was distributed and 654.5 pounds of food was donated from community members and churches. The need for food for families is really starting to increase as the month of November has already brought 11 new families.

**The Wildcat Backpack Program** is going to be run a little differently now that school is going to the distant learning model. If you know a family that could benefit from this program, please have them call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

**Senior Food Delivery**- The Senior Food Delivery Program continues to serve seniors in need of grocery delivery. With COVID cases increasing in our county, there has been an increased amount of calls of those not wanting to leave home and we are thankful we have a way to serve them. If you are interested in delivering or if you know a senior family (or a family that has a difficult time getting out and about), please call Ashley at 320-354-5555.

The Link's **Client Outreach** program served 5 families in the month of October, which was a little less than normal, however, we have seen a great increase of need now in November. With COVID cases spreading quickly, there are more families out of work to be quarantined and less income coming in for those who have lost their jobs. If you are making a financial donation in the near future, please consider this program or donate to the general fund so the money can be used where it is needed most.

The Revive and Redeem Thrift Store, along with The Community Closet continues to be open for the time being. There has been conversation on how to move forward with the new restrictions as safety comes first and foremost. Store changes or closures will be announced on our facebook page. If you would like to call and check in, we can be reached at 354-5555. Revive and Redeem and The Community Closet are located at 206 Main ST. N. and is open Thursdays and Fridays 10-3 and Saturdays from 9-1.

With Christmas soon approaching, we have started to have families calling to see if they can get help with gifts. If you or anyone you know would like to adopt a family or donate any gifts or gift cards, please let us know.
