



A WORD FROM PASTOR TIM

Hi everyone, in honor of Memorial Day and our first day of summer worship, I wrote this piece while deployed many years ago. God's blessings to you! *PT*

In the military, the days of your life often lose meaning. There is a regiment for what you do. You get up, eat, pack, move out to train or work, and come home. To live by a normal Sabbath schedule is difficult. The training schedule says we will train seven days a week, everyday...

Yet, God says Sabbath is part of life itself. It is not a secondary piece at all - instead, it is what life moves toward. Genesis chapter two says, "Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing: so, on the seventh day he rested from all his work. And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done."

Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel wrote: "Six days a week we live under the tyranny of things of space: on the Sabbath we become attuned to holiness in time. It is a day on which we are called upon to share in what is eternal in time, to turn from the results of creation to the mystery of creation, from the world of creation to the creation of the world."

For Jewish peoples, the Sabbath incorporates the most cherished values of their tradition: "the sanctity and dignity of human life, the covenantal relationship between God and Israel, the warmth, closeness and mutual respect of family life, the experience of spiritual joy, and the prospective fulfillment of the 'world-to-come' in the Messianic Era."

What can we do to remind ourselves, "More than Israel has kept the Sabbath, the Sabbath has kept Israel?" We are kept by the Sabbath more than the other way around. In my current setting it means bringing the Sabbath with me to the field when I go. I pack devotionals, Bibles, Holy Communion, religious supplies for our Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and other Christian believers. I also bring books for our other soldier's faith traditions including Jewish and Muslim. (I would add other traditions now including Hindu.)

We can't spend a whole day of rest right now, but we can share the peace, rejoice in the company of other saints, receive our Lord's Supper upon our lips and into our bodies, hear the Word of God which created the world, and be blessed upon our way. The Word of God spoken, eaten, and lived brings Shabbat (Sabbath) to people in the field. It brings us rest; it brings us promise; it brings us Christ.

TASK FORCE RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL

The space task force has made a recommendation to the church council. After much research, discussion and prayer, the task force recommends the space to become an integral part of our church using it as a multi generational life center.

First, this will increase space for our children and youth, providing them with movement areas, education and a brighter, fun atmosphere to gather. The younger generation will be the future of our church. A dynamic program will enhance growth with younger families, feeling connected to Faith's mission of Nurture, Inspire and Share.

Secondly, there will be an opportunity to delegate spaces for multi generational use such as arts and crafts, music, book clubs, yoga, adult education and many more. The task force visualizes the spaces to be shared with our members and our community. This may result in repurposing some of the existing spaces as well.

The church council is determined to move forward with this recommendation. Our short term goal is to use the next month for taping and repair, paint and buff and seal the vinyl floors. During this time, I'd like to create a small group to volunteer as an "implementation team". This team will evaluate the spaces, dream about the inviting bright atmosphere and implement the next step towards completing a few areas that will be ready for next fall.

Our long term goal is then to analyze spaces within our existing areas, perhaps reorganizing spaces that fit into the next decade of Faith's Mission.

With limited resources, but a lot of creative and talented members, we are driven to make Faith Church an inviting place to love Jesus and share his love through our ministries.

Thank you Faith members for your participation. It was exciting to see the outpouring of ideas from members young and old. Thanks for your suggestions and to the task force members who unselfishly gave up Sunday mornings for meetings to discuss these ideas and formulate a recommendation. Onward we go!
