Disabled Veteran: A veteran of the U.S. military who is entitled to compensation (or who but for the receipt of military retired pay would be entitled to compensation) under laws administered by the Department of Veterans’ Affairs for a disability – a) rated at 30% or more; b) rated at 10 or 20% in the case of a veteran who has been determined under Section 38 U.S.C. 3106 to have a serious employment handicap; or c) a person who was released from active duty because of service connected disability.

Vietnam Era Veteran: A person who (I) served on active duty in the U.S. military for a period of more than 180 days, and who was discharged or released there from with other than a dishonorable discharge, if any part of such active duty was performed: (A) in the Republic of Vietnam between February 28, 1961 and May 7, 1975; or (B) between August 5, 1964, and May 7, 1975, in all other cases; OR; (II) was discharged or released from active duty in the U.S. military, ground, naval, or air service for a service connected disability if any part of such active duty was performed (A) in the Republic of Vietnam between February 28, 1961 and May 7, 1975; or (B) between August 5, 1964 and May 7, 1975, in any other location.

Other Eligible Veteran: Veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. military during a war or in a campaign or expedition for which a campaign badge, a service medal, or an expeditionary medal has been authorized.
