

This is the time of year when homeowners begin to make repairs, improvements and changes to their homes. Please remember that any structural changes including garages must be approved before construction if started. Per the Protective Covenants, plans are to be submitted in duplicate to the Board.

- Privacy fences are **NOT** permitted. Fences are to be chain link not to exceed 4 ft. in height.
- Homes should remain of neutral color scheme
- If you have questions, please ask before making changes
- Please clean up around your property. Your property reflects who you are

**FRIENDLY REMINDER:** Garbage pick-ups are Friday. We ask that you bring your cans out Thursday afternoon/evening, and bring them back in on Friday before sundown. Failure to do so will result in fines being levied on the homeowner.
