GENERAL WELFARE & PROPERTY STANDARDS

Some tips to know this summer:

- Illinois has a noise ordinance which prohibits loud parties after 10 p.m. Please respect your neighbors by ending your parties at a reasonable hour, and by turning down loud music.
- Please curb your pet. Pet waste attracts rodents, not to mention being unsightly and ruining your neighbor's lawn. Please clean up all dog feces.
- All dogs MUST be leashed. Failure to do so will result in penalties as allowable by law.
- Garbage pick-ups are Friday. We ask that you bring your cans out Thursday afternoon/evening, and bring them back in Friday afternoon before sundown.
- Department of Sanitation has requested that all lawn clipping bags be placed in the garbage receptacle, not on the curb.
 Notify your lawn care service of this courtesy. The bags can be quite heavy for the garbage personnel to lift.



SAFETY & SECURITY

As the summer progresses, we cannot stress enough the importance of security. In June, there was a home invasion in the 1200 block of East 85th Street. This incident occurred at 2:00 a.m. Now is an excellent time to reassess your security needs. All crime cannot be prevented, but you can take steps to minimize your home's chances of being burglarized:

- Get an alarm system (Ring Doorbell, ADT, SimpliSafe, Brinks Home Security, Nest Secure, etc.)
- Program exterior lights to come on at dusk and turn off at dawn
- * Trim back bushes/update landscaping with yard lighting
- * Add window sensors, including glass break sensors
- * Add a security sign/stickers
- Add security cameras in front and back of your property

Also, be mindful of your surroundings. When parking be sure to BACK IN to your driveway.

Speed limit on Marynook streets is 25 MPH. Be mindful of any children who may be playing in the streets, as well as bicyclists.
