## B's Buzz

October, 2023



The season of fall is traditionally about harvest and reaping the fruit of our labors. At Spokes, October means Game Day is here--when we come together and spend a beautiful day enjoying games and/or

connecting with our friends, sharing favorite foods from our kitchens, and offering up unneeded, but gently-used (or unused!) household and personal items for others to treasure.

***Why do we gather, play, eat, and shop the bake sale and silent auction on Game Day?*** Because giving back to the community has always been a key mission of Central Florida Spokes. In May, 2023, we donated \$6,000 to three local organizations—I-Dignity, JOSH (Just Our Soldiers' Helpers) and Journey's End. We also collected \$20 gift cards for Seniors First holiday baskets, lipsticks for Find Your Fabulosity to assist their efforts to help abused women, and sewed, stuffed, and delivered 450 heart pillows for cardiac surgery patients.

I'd like to share a short story, of unknown origin, which beautifully describes how helping others benefits all of us.

#### ***Blue Ribbon Winning Corn***

*One year a newspaper reporter interviewed a farmer about his state fair prize-winning corn and learned something interesting about how*



*he grew it. The reporter discovered that the farmer shared his seed corn with his neighbors.*

*“How can you afford to share your best seed corn with your neighbors when they are entering corn in competition with yours each year?” the reporter asked.*

*“Why sir,” said the farmer, “didn’t you know? The wind picks up pollen from the ripening corn and swirls it from field to field. If my neighbors grow inferior corn, cross-pollination will steadily degrade the quality of my corn. If I am to grow good corn, I must help my neighbors grow good corn.”*

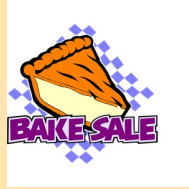
Cookies anyone? This is for anyone who likes to eat...and that means everybody!

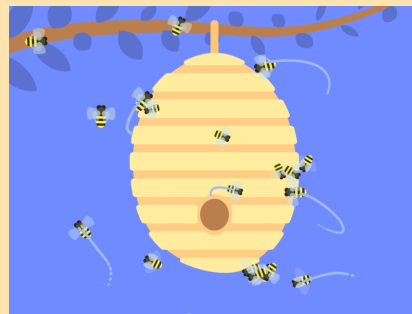

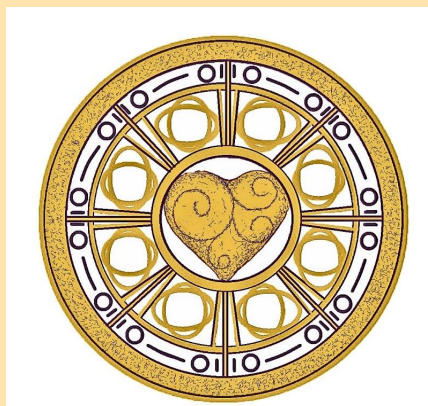
