It was a slow process, made more difficult without a Post home. He and his wife, Sandy, spent many evenings at restaurants waiting for members to come for a meeting. It was slow going but eventually people, American Legion members wishing to transfer to a local Post, and folks who wanted to be a part of the American Legion, started showing up and membership slowly grew. After one year, Bob turned the Post over to a new Commander. The next commanders picked up where Bob left off, membership continued to grow and the Auxiliary, SAL and American Legion Riders were formed.

The second time Bob got the call and stepped up to help again was in 2021, when we lost Commander Rick Starkey to COVID.

Our Post needed his experience and leadership to get the members through this terrible time and Bob accepted the challenge. He spent 1½ years as Commander, growing and uniting the membership, before health issues caused him first to take a leave of absence and later to resign as Commander.

Bob recently transferred to post 58 in Dunnellon where his wife Sandy is the ALA Chaplain.

We, the members of Post 166, will always be indebted to him for his leadership when the Post needed it most.

We wish Commander Scott success with his future endeavors and pray for his health to improve. We will miss him, but he will be just a phone call away.

## **National Veterans Creative Arts Festival**

Since 2000, the American Legion National Auxiliary has co-presented the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival, with the Department of Veterans Affairs. Carrying out the Auxiliary's mission of Service Not Self, members, units, and departments support the local competitions, the Festival, and make generous monetary donations to help carry out this event.

Creative arts is a way to help veterans recover from, and cope with, physical and emotional disabilities. Each year, veterans enrolled at VA health care facilities showcase their talents in local creative arts competitions.

This annual competition recognizes the progress and recovery made through that therapy and raises the visibility of the creative achievements of our Nation's Veterans.

The visual arts division includes 51 categories, ranging from oil paintings to leatherwork, to paint-by-number kits. In the performing arts division, there are 100 categories related to all aspects of music, dance, drama, and creative writing.

Through a national judging process, first, second, and third place entries in each category are determined. Only selected first place winners are featured at the Festival.

This year, The American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Florida, has been asked to assist in hosting the National Creative Arts .

District 4 Auxiliary is responsible for a hospitality suite that will provide food and drinks and a quiet place for the veterans and their caregivers during the event. All units in District 4 made donations for the Hospitality room. Unit 166 donated coffee creamers and sugar packets for the hospitality room.

This year the event will be located in St. Petersburg, Florida from April 18, 2022 to April 25, 2022.
