I would like to share with you the latest on the America Legion's Ian Hurricane Disaster Plan and how we can help at the Post level.

Disaster Preparedness Chairman, Bill Hoppner, and many other Legion Family representatives have traveled the state assessing damage and learning the varying needs of our Legion Family as they recover from Hurricane Ian.

We are now in Phase 2 of relief efforts, and monetary donations to Department's Hurricane Relief Fund are encouraged as each location needs are different as they rebuild, therefore making it difficult getting the right items to the right areas. Make checks payable to The American Legion, Department of Florida, and include "Hurricane Relief" in the memo line.

If you would like to provide physical items, the list below focuses on building and cleaning supplies as these are the most requested items. There is plenty of water and canned food. As you know, we do not have much room at our Post so if you can, please take you donations to Post 237. They have an enclosed trailer where you may take your items. Take them to the back of the Post and leave them in the hut. Their volunteers will get the items into the trailer. They ask that you call ahead and let them know you are coming.

If you cannot get to Post 237, please call Debbie at 727/432-7230 and let her know what you have and we will either ask you to bring it to the Post or try to get someone to pick up your donations.

Phase 2 - Hurricane Items Needed

Chain or hand saws

Utility gloves

Tools (shovel, rake, ax, pry bar, trimmers, etc.)

Drills & drill bits (battery operated)
Plywood (5/8" or roofing thickness)

Nails or grabber screws

Peel and stick roofing materials Tung & groove wood panels

Roofing shingles

Cement drywall (Durock)

Tarps

Utility buckets

Dusk masks

Cleaning supplies (disinfectant wipes, dust rags, bleach, liquid detergent, brooms, mops, etc.)

First aid items (band aids, antibacterial ointment, gauze, medical tape, aspirin, rubbing alcohol, etc.)

Hygiene items (shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, mouthwash, etc.)

Bug spray Sunscreen

Infant supplies (diapers, wipes, food, formula)

Feminine products

Pet food

Children's toys or activities

Packaged undergarments (all sizes)

On Sunday January 15th we are planning a BBQ. Plan to attend and check out our cooking skills on a grill! More details to follow in next month's newsletter.




