News from the CP1 Board

From HOA President, Don Nelson

The HOA Board has selected February as the month to inspect all the townhouses in Casa Paloma 1. Eight teams of two will be taking a section each to inspect the outside of the homes for signs of deterioration, unauthorized paint colors, landscaping gone wild and things that bring down the appearance and property values of the whole. It's important to all of us to keep our HOA properties looking as nice as we can.

At the end of January you should have received **ballots** for 2 positions on the HOA Board. They need to be mailed back by February 15. Included with the ballots was my **President's letter** and an **Emergency Contact form**. The office needs this Emergency Contact information **from every homeowner** so we can help you in case of emergency.

HOA dues: Our annual HOA dues, which were \$200, are now \$220 for 2019. The increase will go into the road reserve fund. But even with this 10%

raise, our dues are still a bargain. They remain among the lowest dues of any housing development in Green Valley. Mailing end of Feb, due April 1. This payment is coming up in March.

Recyclables: Waste Management is asking us to **please clean out our cans and bottles for recycling** and throw away the lids. They say that once a dirty jar or can goes into a recycle batch, it messes it up so badly that they have to throw out the whole batch.

Solicitors: Casa Paloma 1 has a “NO SOLICITORS” sign out front. You may certainly refuse their solicitations if they come to your door. This includes religious solicitors as well as business solicitors. They very often prey on the elderly. Many of our residents have been unjustly exploited by offers at their front door that sound

too good to be true (if you act quickly!). You are free to turn them away, citing the sign clearly printed at the entrance to CP1. Also, if a person shows up asking you to buy something or join something, please report the visit to one of our officers: **Don Nelson**, (425-518-2579), **Ken VanRooy** (406-231-1074) or **Ray U’Ren** (850-292-5017). They can take steps to ban that person from our neighborhood. Thank you.

IMPORTANT SAFETY TIP:

Don’t be afraid to call 911 for anything that looks suspicious or dangerous to your neighborhood. This includes suspicious animals (snakes) as well as suspicious people or a suspicious absence.
