They have been taking place in the CP1 Recreation Center usually every <u>third Friday</u> of the month with the exception of summer months (there are other exceptions - we had a great BBQ dinner on July 4th). The sign-up chart for the next potluck is always posted on the bulletin board under the patio roof by the pool. It is important to sign up because the capacity limitation for our meeting room (set by the Fire Department) is 55 people. - Many of our CP1 rules are based on County, State and/or Federal laws. "All
 dogs on a leash" is one of them as well as cleaning up after your pet. The
 County provides many Dog Parks where dogs can run free. Two of them are in
 or near Green Valley. Check online for directions.
- Contacting a committee chair responsible for your particular concern before you contact the Board (except for those doing double duty) helps to prevent burn out by our all-volunteer Board. If we cannot operate on a volunteer basis, then we'll have to hire a management company which will escalate our HOA fees.
- Taking steps to develop understanding and good relations with your neighbors is, in the long, one of the best things you can do in order to enjoy the hospitality, security, and peace of this incredible location. Reach out.

With that, I look forward to seeing all of you at the HOA Board meetings and I hope that you will be interested in getting involved in our committees and social activities. Always remember, we are happy to have you with us.
