Lamplighters

If you need to replace your lamppost light bulb, be sure it is no brighter than 40-60 watts so it doesn't blow out the sensor. If you are unable to change your own light bulb, you may call **Ken VanRooy at 1-406-231- 1074** or **Don Nelson at 1-425-518-2579**. They will change it and then watch it to be

sure the lamp goes on at nightfall and goes off at daybreak. If it doesn't, they will change out your sensor, and the cost of that (\$10 to \$20) is yours. Hopefully that will light up your house again. ☺

That reminds me it's also a great time to touch up any sun-bleached paint on our houses since it's becoming more and more pleasant to work outside. CP1 has an array of approved colors which characterize our development. These are posted next to the CP1 pool. Ace Hardware in Green Valley Mall can mix the colors by name and they have reasonable prices.

There is one glitch to watch for when repainting your car port. If you share a car port structure with a neighbor, the architectural rules require that the entire structure be the same approved color. So it is a good idea to get together with your neighbor and repaint both sides at the same time.

As we maintain our community architectural standards and keep our properties looking nice, we all win. It projects a pleasing appearance and it helps keep our property values up.

Lock Boxes

Lock boxes holding your residence's key are designed to be a secure method of letting the District Firefighters and Paramedics into your house in the event you cannot open your own door. The boxes are extremely strong and can only be opened by a special coded key carried on the fire truck. The lock box would be opened only in case of emergency by the GVFD firefighters.

Lock boxes are recommended for those whose unit stands empty for long periods of the year. It is also of great value for those who live alone, to help if you should fall inside your locked house and the paramedics need to get to you.

The one-time cost of a lock box is \$50. You may purchase one by calling the **Fire Prevention Office at 625-9438**. This number is manned Monday to Thursday from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm. The fire department will install it for you for a \$25 fee, but **Tom Shane** (376 Sonador, Ph. **664-2420**) will install it for Casa Paloma 1 residents free of charge. Thank you, Tom!

Green Valley Council

Casa Paloma 1 is a member of the **Green Valley Council** along with many of Green Valley's Home Owners' Associations (HOAs) and local businesses. *Since Green Valley is not an incorporated town and therefore run by Pima County, the Green Valley Council has organized itself with standing committees of volunteers which approximate departments a city might have, such as Traffic, Health and Human Services, Planning, Architectural and so forth. The Council*

meets the **3rd Thursday of the month (Sept. to May) from 8:30-10:00 at Desert Hills Rec Center** with representatives of all the Pima County departments to discuss our corporate concerns. News Around Green Valley

The **Canoe Golf Course** will still be a long time in planning before anything happens. The County is “considering” the maintenance and upkeep involved. Making it a park is not a done deal yet.

Jim Pinkerton will lead the **Community Pride Day** on November 4TH at 8:00 a.m. until noon. This is a day set aside for all willing helpers to “spruce up

Green Valley Hospital has a monthly newsletter update. The Council’s Health & Human Services Committee prints the letter. The hospital will have a meeting **November 6th** at West Social Center at 2:00 p.m. Call **393-4700** and ask for John Matuska or Mona Smith for the latest services.

The Volunteer Clearing House now has 100 community organizations on its data base to help people find interesting volunteering projects (and good speakers for events). The office is under the Pima County Council on Aging and is in the Friends in Deed building. Check it out; call **625-1150 Ext108** and leave a message.

Much of the meeting was given to a discussion of Pima County roads, 2/3 of which are rated “poor” or “failed.” Supervisor Steve Christy is backing a plan to repeal the \$0.25 property tax increase for roads and impose instead a half-cent sales tax for Pima County for the next 10 years. It’s the only way, he says, Pima County can raise enough money for this problem any time soon.
