Since 2024 has come to an end and we've entered 2025, we wanted to thank everyone who has supported us this last year, and years past. We couldn't help St. Louis children without you. This year we raised money for our endowment at St. Louis Children's Hospital, our college scholarships, and C.O.P.S., a camp for surviving children, and their parent or legal guardian, of law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty.

Endowment at St. Louis Children's Hospital

We've funded the Paige Sandra Murie Suter endowment at St. Louis Children's Hospital since December of 2012. We started the endowment with \$12,000 and now it is at over \$188,000.

This endowment funds the Pediatric Neurocritical Care Program, which is run by Dr. Jose Pineda, who treated Paige at St. Louis Children's Hospital when she suffered a fatal brain aneurysm in 2006. Funds are used to educate first responders in identifying and caring for children with brain injuries as well as multi-disciplinary treatment for children once they arrive at the hospital, leading to better outcomes for recovery.

We could not continue to fund the endowment without your help, thank you for your support to our organization. Our hope is that no other family must grieve the loss of a child to brain injuries or illness.
