





**Ontwaking
Sam and Stephen Belinfante**

An intergenerational exhibition by father and son Stephen and Sam Belinfante.

The title *Ontwaking* ('awakening') is taken from an orchestral work by the forgotten Dutch composer Daniël Belinfante, a cousin of Stephen who died in Auschwitz in 1945, just before it was liberated. The score for this work was uncovered by the artists during a research trip to Amsterdam and The Hague, where numerous Belinfantes once lived and worked. Across the family tree are people who not only practiced art and music professionally but used their dexterity to evade capture and support others through acts of resistance.

In this exhibition, Stephen and Sam Belinfante probe the difficulties of perceiving history and memory through their respective mediums – Stephen in painting, collage and works on fabric, and Sam through film and sound works.






**Graveyards to die for: How 19th
Century London buried its dead**
Lecturer: Charlie Forman

Charlie is a London walking tour guide and lecturer who highlights the social, architectural and artistic history of his home city, which he is passionate about. 




